



## Protection of Word “Anzac” Regulations<sup>2</sup> (Amendment)

### Statutory Rules 1989 No. 419<sup>1</sup>

I, THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations under the *War Precautions Act Repeal Act 1920*.

#### Principal Regulations

1. In these Regulations, “**Principal Regulations**” means the Protection of Word “Anzac” Regulations.

#### Prohibition of use in trade etc of word “Anzac”

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is amended by omitting from the foot of subregulation (1) “Penalty: One hundred pounds or imprisonment for six months, or both.”.

#### Prohibition of word “Anzac” as name of street, road or park

3. Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations is amended by omitting from the foot of subregulation (1) “Penalty: One hundred pounds.”.
