Amendments to the Schedule of Fees

An Extraordinary Session of the Assembly of the PCT Union was held in Geneva on 31 March 2008 to discuss proposed amendments of the Schedule of Fees annexed to the PCT Regulations. The Assembly approved the amendments, which will enter into force on 1 July 2008, and will apply to any international application which is received by the receiving Office on or after 1 July 2008. The amendments are as follows:

Reduction in the international filing fee

The international filing fee will be reduced by 5%, from 1,400 to 1,330 Swiss francs. Equivalent amounts in other currencies will be announced once, following consultation with interested Offices, they have been established. Note that the amount payable for each sheet of the international application in excess of 30 sheets will not change.

Increase in the fee reduction accorded to applicants from certain States

The reduction in the international filing fee and the handling fee accorded to applicants who meet the criteria indicated in Item $4(a)^1$ or $(b)^2$ of the Schedule of Fees has been increased from 75% to 90%.

Extension of the scope of the fee reduction accorded to applicants from certain States

An applicant who is a natural person and who is a national of and resides in one of the following nine States will also be entitled to the above-mentioned reduction in the international filing fee and the handling fee:

Antigua and Barbuda Bahrain Barbados Libyan Arab Jamahiriya Oman Seychelles Singapore

¹ If the international application is filed by an applicant who is a natural person and who is a national of and resides in a State whose per capita national income is below 3,000 US dollars (according to the average per capita national income figures used by the United Nations for determining its scale of assessments for the contributions payable for the years 1995, 1996 and 1997).

² If the international application is filed by an applicant, whether a natural person or not, who is a national of and resides in a State that is classed as a least developed country by the United Nations.

Trinidad and Tobago

United Arab Emirates

The PCT Assembly will consider a study on the eligibility criteria for the fee reductions in item 4 at its next session, and discuss further possible changes.

New PCT Contracting State

Sao Tome and Principe (country code: ST)

On 3 April 2008, Sao Tome and Principe deposited its instrument of accession to the PCT, and on 3 July 2008, will become bound by the PCT. Consequently, any international application filed on or after 3 July 2008 will automatically include the designation of Sao Tome and Principe.

Also, because Sao Tome and Principe will be bound by Chapter II of the PCT, it will automatically be elected in any demand filed in respect of an international application filed on or after 3 July 2008. Furthermore, nationals and residents of Sao Tome and Principe will be entitled, as from 3 July 2008, to file international applications under the PCT.

CA Canada (fees – corrigendum)

The date of effect of the change in the equivalent amounts of the international filing fee, and the fee per sheet over 30, payable in CAD to the Canadian Intellectual Property Office as receiving Office, as well as the change in the equivalent amount in CAD of the PCT-EASY fee reduction (see item 3(a) of the Schedule of Fees), as published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 03/2008, should have read 15 May 2008 and not 1 May 2008.

For payments made on or after 1 April 2008, the search fee is reduced by EUR 890 for international applications filed on or after 1 July 2005 for which the international search report has been established by the Austrian Patent Office, or, in accordance with the Protocol on Centralization, by the National Board of Patents and Registration of Finland, the Nordic Patent Institute, the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office or the Swedish Patent and Registration Office.

There has been a change in the special requirements under PCT Rule 51*bis* of the EPO as designated (or elected) Office concerning the time limit to comply with all of its requirements. If not already complied with within the time limit applicable under PCT Article 22 or 39(1) (31 months from the priority date), the EPO will invite the applicant to comply with the requirements within two months.

Change to the Publication Schedule

Publication of 2 May 2008

Due to the fact that Thursday, 1 May 2008, will be a non-working day at WIPO, the PCT applications which would normally have been published on that day, as well as any *Official Notices (PCT Gazette)* which would normally have been published on that day, will be published on Friday, 2 May 2008.

Note that the completion of technical preparations for that publication will take place more than the usual 15 days before publication, on Wednesday, 16 April 2008, meaning that any changes which should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication should be received by the International Bureau by midnight on Tuesday, 15 April 2008.

Publication of 15 May 2008

Due to the fact that Thursday, 1 May 2008 and Monday, 12 May 2008 will be non-working days at WIPO, the completion of technical preparations for the PCT applications to be published on Thursday, 15 May 2008 will take place earlier than usual, on Tuesday, 29 April 2008 (instead of on Wednesday, 30 April 2008, the day on which technical preparations would normally have been completed). This means that any changes which should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication should be received by the International Bureau by midnight on Monday, 28 April 2008.

EPO: Change Concerning Payment Methods

The European Patent Office (EPO) has informed the International Bureau that it has abolished checks as a payment method with effect from 1 April 2008. As a result, any payment by check which is delivered or sent direct to the EPO will no longer be accepted as from that date.

As from 1 April 2008, fees payable to the EPO are to be paid:

- by payment or transfer to a bank account held by the Office in a Contracting State of the EPC, or
- via a deposit account held with the Office.

Practical Advice

Appointing agents before the International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authority

Q: The firm of European patent attorneys with which I work erroneously filed an international application, for which the only applicant was neither a resident nor a national of a member State of the European Patent Convention, with the European Patent Office (EPO) as receiving Office. The application was subsequently transmitted by the EPO to the International Bureau as receiving Office (RO/IB) under PCT Rule 19.4(a)(i). Is it possible for my firm to act as agent for the applicant before RO/IB, or will the applicant have to appoint an agent from his country of nationality or residence? If we cannot act as agent before RO/IB, can we be appointed as agent before the EPO in its capacity as International Searching Authority (ISA) and International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), specifically for the purposes of international search and preliminary examination? (The EPO is a competent ISA and IPEA for this application.)

A: It is recalled that, under PCT Rule 83.1*bis*(a), in order to be able to represent the applicant before RO/IB, the agent must have the right to practice before the national (or regional) Office of, or acting for, a Contracting State of which the applicant is a resident or national. It is unlikely that your firm of patent attorneys would be entitled to represent the applicant unless there is somebody who is a patent attorney or patent agent registered before the Office concerned (see under the relevant receiving Office in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Receiving Offices, Annex C) (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/index.html), and so if the applicant is going to appoint an agent, it must be one who fulfils that requirement.

You do, however, have the option of being appointed, under PCT Rule 90.1(b) and (c), as agent specifically for the purposes of search and examination before an ISA and IPEA. Any agent may be so appointed, irrespective of the receiving Office with which the application was filed and irrespective of any agent who is entitled to act for the application concerned under PCT Rule 90.1(a) for the entire international phase, provided that he/she has the right to practice before the national Office or intergovernmental organization which acts as ISA/IPEA (for information on who has the right to practice before a national or regional Office, see the relevant National Chapter (Summary) of the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, or contact the Office concerned). In your case, since you have the right to practice before the EPO in its capacity as ISA and IPEA, the applicant could appoint you as agent specifically before the EPO.

In practice, it is not absolutely necessary to appoint an agent specifically for the purposes of international search since there is no dialogue with the ISA during the search procedure and an agent would not normally file any document directly with the ISA (amendments under PCT Article 19 are filed with the IB by the applicant or the agent entitled to act before the receiving Office). Such an agent would simply receive the international search report and the written opinion of the ISA. During the international preliminary examination procedure, however, the agent may need to respond to the written opinion of the IPEA or have a dialogue with the examiner. In the case where an additional person is appointed specifically for the procedure before the IPEA, all notifications issued by the IPEA will be addressed only to that additional person, and not to any agent appointed in general for the purposes of the international phase. Note, however, that such an agent would only be able to take action concerning the international preliminary examination procedure, to withdraw the international application.

In order for you to be appointed in this way, a separate power of attorney would normally have to be submitted directly to the ISA and/or IPEA, as the case may be (see PCT Rule 90.4(b)). Note, however, that a power of attorney may not be required where the ISA/IPEA has waived the requirement to furnish a power of attorney (PCT Rule 90.4(d))–see the table entitled "Waivers: Powers of Attorney" at:

Instead of submitting a power of attorney to appoint an agent before the IPEA, the appointment can also be made simply by way of the applicant signing the demand for international preliminary examination (Form PCT/IPEA/401) in which the agent is named in Box No. III as "agent specifically for the procedure before the IPEA".

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filing fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 3(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). Any State indicated in **bold italics** has adhered to the PCT but will only become bound by the PCT on the date shown in parentheses; it will not be considered to have been designated in international applications filed before that date.

Note that even though the filing of a request constitutes under PCT Rule 4.9(a) the designation of all Contracting States bound by the PCT on the international filing date, for the grant of every kind of protection available and, where applicable, for the grant of both regional and national patents, applicants should always use the latest versions of the request form (PCT/RO/101) and demand form (PCT/IPEA/401) (the latest versions are dated April 2007) or, if filing the request using the PCT-EASY features of the PCT-SAFE software, the latest version of that software (which is available at: www.wipo.int/pct-safe).
