#### PCT Filings in 2008

The number of international applications filed under the PCT in 2008 reached nearly 164,000, representing an increase of 2.4% over 2007. Although this growth rate is more modest than in recent years (the previous three years had seen an average growth rate of 9.3%), it was somewhat expected, given the global economic slowdown of recent months, and this figure nevertheless represents the highest number of applications ever received under the PCT. **This and the following figures for 2008 are estimates** as the International Bureau continues to receive, throughout the first half of 2009, PCT applications which were filed with national and regional Offices in 2008, and final figures will be available later in the year.

The top five countries of filing remained the same as last year, with applicants from the United States of America filing the largest number of applications (53,521, which represents 32.7% of all applications), followed by Japan (17.5%), Germany (11.3%), the Republic of Korea (4.8%) and France (4.2%). Applicants from the member States of the European Patent Convention, when grouped together, filed about 34.4% of all international applications.

There was continued high growth in filings from north east Asia, in particular from the Republic of Korea (12% increase) and China (11.9% increase), and Sweden enjoyed a particularly high growth compared to other European countries with a 12.5% increase.

For the first time, a Chinese company topped the list of PCT applicants in 2008 – Huawei Technologies Co. Ltd, a major international telecommunications company based in Shenzhen, filed 1,737 PCT applications in 2008, and the Japanese company Panasonic Corporation<sup>1</sup> followed closely behind with 1,729 applications. Applicants are increasingly submitting their international applications electronically – filings in electronic form made up about 73.3% of all filings in 2008 (compared to 67.4% in 2007), 63.1% being filed fully electronically and 10.2% being filed using the PCT-EASY functionality of the PCT-SAFE software, whereas only 26.6% of applications filed in 2008 were filed entirely on paper (compared to 32.6% in 2007).

The fields of technology in which the highest proportions of PCT applications were published in 2008 related to medical technology (12.0%), computer technology (8.5%) and pharmaceuticals (7.9%). The fastest growing technology areas were information technology methods for management (22.7% increase) and micro-structures and nanotechnology (20.7%).

The figures for 2008 have also revealed an improvement in the timeliness of certain receiving Offices, International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities, in particular the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO), which has made extra efforts to improve its delivery of services under the PCT. There was a significant improvement in the timeliness of the transmittal of copies of PCT applications by the USPTO as receiving Office to the IB, with nearly 60% of records copies of international applications being sent to the IB within four weeks from receipt of the application at the receiving Office. There was also a marked improvement in the timeliness of the transmittal of international search reports (ISRs) to the IB with 43% of ISRs being sent to the IB within 18 months from the priority date. #### **Changes to the Publication Schedule**

#### **Publication of 23 April 2009**

Due to the fact that Friday, 10 April and Monday, 13 April 2009 will be non-working days at WIPO, the completion of technical preparations for the PCT applications to be published on 23 April 2009 (publication No. 17/2009) will take place earlier than usual, on Tuesday, 7 April 2009 (instead of on Wednesday, 8 April 2009, the day on which technical preparations would normally have been completed). This means that any changes which should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication should be received by the International Bureau by midnight, Geneva time, on Monday, 6 April 2009.

## Note to US Applicants about Choosing the Australian Patent Office as ISA and IPEA

It is recalled that since 1 November 2008, it has been possible for applicants who are nationals or residents of the United States of America, and who file their international application with either the United States Patent and Trademark Office or the International Bureau as receiving Office, to choose the Australian Patent Office as International Searching Authority (ISA) and/or International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA) (see *PCT Newsletter* No. 10/2008, page 7).

It has come to our attention that a number of US applicants have been choosing the Australian Patent Office as ISA and/or IPEA despite the fact that the claims in their international application relate to fields of technology which have been excluded by that Office. The attention of applicants concerned is drawn to the list of excluded subject matter that was published in *PCT Newsletter* No. 11/2008, page 3.

#### **PCT Information Update**

#### Fees payable in US dollars (various Offices)

As from 1 April 2009, there will be a change in the equivalent amounts of the international filing fee and the fee per sheet over 30, payable in USD to various receiving Offices (see list of two-letter codes of Offices affected, below), as well as a change in the equivalent amounts in USD of the electronic filing fee reductions listed in item 4 of the Schedule of Fees, as indicated in Fee Table I(a).

#### **AU Australia (competent International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authorities)**

The Australian Patent Office, in its capacity as receiving Office, has specified, with effect from 1 March 2009, the Korean Intellectual Property Office, in addition to the Australian Patent Office, as competent International Searching and Preliminary Examining Authority for international applications filed by nationals and residents of Australia.

#### DK Denmark (time limit for entry into the national phase – corrigendum)

It was announced in *PCT Newsletter* No. 01/2009, page 3, that special time limits apply with respect to entry into the national phase in the Faroe Islands and Greenland, and that for these areas, the time limit is 20 months from the priority date (or from the international filing date where there is no priority claim). The Danish Patent and Trademark Office has notified the International Bureau (IB), however, that, although the time limit for entry into the national phase where a demand for international preliminary examination has been filed is 30 months from the priority date for Greenland, the time limit for the Faroe Islands is 25 months from the priority date.

For the rest of the Danish territory, the time limit is 31 months from the priority date, with the possibility of extending that time limit by two months.

## **GB** United Kingdom (fees, acceptance of international applications with requests in PCT-EASY format)

As from 1 April 2009, there will be a change in the equivalent amounts of the international filing fee and the fee per sheet over 30, payable in GBP to the United Kingdom Intellectual Property Office (an operating name of the Patent Office) as receiving Office (RO/GB), as well as a change in the equivalent amounts in GBP of the electronic filing fee reductions listed in item 4 of the Schedule of Fees, as indicated in Fee Table I(a) (noting that the equivalent amount of the PCT-EASY fee reduction will be removed as from 1 April 2009 – see below).

The RO/GB has notified the IB that, with effect from 1 April 2009, it will no longer accept PCT applications in PCT-EASY format (that is, applications filed on paper and accompanied by the request form data and abstract on a physical medium). Moreover, from 1 April 2009, no international application filed with RO/GB will benefit from the fee reduction applicable to PCT-EASY applications (see Item 4(a) of the PCT Schedule of Fees).

Therefore, any PCT application filed on or after 1 April 2009 with the RO/GB using the PCT-EASY mode of the PCT-SAFE software will be treated as a paper filing, the full international filing fee will be required, and the diskette will no longer be transmitted to the IB. Moreover, the PCT-SAFE software will be modified accordingly when the RO/GB is selected as receiving Office.

As a result of this change, the options for filing a PCT application at the RO/GB on or after 1 April 2009 will be:

- (1) Paper filing
- (2) Electronic filing:
  - (a) PCT-SAFE (WIPO software) in:
    - PDF format or
    - XML format

or

- (b) EPO's Online Filing software in:
  - PDF format or
  - XML format

#### **Practical Advice**

## The appointment of agents having the right to practice before an Authority specified for supplementary international search

Q: I am the agent in respect of an international application, and have appointed a sub-agent to act specifically for the purposes of the procedure before the International Searching Authority (ISA), and will be appointing that same agent to act specifically for the procedure before the International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), which will be the same Office as the ISA. Because of the nature of the technology and the potential importance of the invention, I feel that the international application would benefit from a supplementary international search, and would therefore like to know whether the above-mentioned sub-agent can also act as agent for the purposes of the procedure before the Authority specified for supplementary international search?

A: Although it is not really necessary to appoint an agent specifically for the purpose of supplementary international search (SIS) (there would not normally be any dialogue between that Authority and an agent, and only a limited number of documents, if any, may need to be submitted to that Authority (for example, where required, a copy of any sequence listing in electronic form or a translation into a language accepted by the Authority which is to carry out the SIS)), you do have the option of appointing such a sub-agent, and may wish to, especially if you have already appointed such a sub-agent for the purposes of international search and preliminary examination.

Note, however, that according to PCT Rule 90.1(d)(ii), you may only appoint a sub-agent to act as agent specifically for the purposes of the procedure before the Authority specified for supplementary international search (SIS) if that sub-agent has the right to practice before the national Office or the intergovernmental organization (henceforth referred to as "Office") which acts in that capacity. If this is the case, you will be able to widen the scope of the existing sub-agent's appointment to cover the procedure before the Authority specified for SIS. To do this, you should mark the third check-box under Box No. III of the supplementary search request form (PCT/IB/375) and fill in that agent's details in that Box.

If the existing sub-agent does not have the right to practice before the Office which acts as an Authority specified for SIS, you would be able to act as general agent for the purposes of the procedure before that Authority (as, unless otherwise specified by the applicant, you have the right to practice in respect of the whole of the international procedure), since, according to PCT Rule 90.1, a person having the right to practice before the Office with which the international application is filed (or, where the international application is filed with the International Bureau (IB), having the right to practice in respect of the international application before the IB (see PCT Rule 83.1*bis*)), may be appointed by the applicant as his agent to represent him before the receiving Office, the IB, the International Searching Authority, any Authority specified for SIS and the International Preliminary Examining Authority. In this situation, you would mark the first check-box under Box No. III of the supplementary search request and fill in the necessary parts of that Box.

If you wish, you also have the option of appointing a further sub-agent who has the right to practice before the Office or organization which acts as the Authority specified for SIS (PCT Rule 90.1(d)(ii)), in which case you should mark the third check-box under Box No. III of the supplementary search request and provide the necessary details of that new agent. Since you, as appointed agent of the international application, would be appointing the sub-agent, the signature of the applicant would not be required. Note that the sub-agent would only be able to take action concerning the SIS procedure, and would not be entitled to take action on any other matters.

The international filling fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b), (c) and (d) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 202(A). A 90% reduction in the international filing fee (including the fee per sheet over 30) and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—see footnotes 2 and 12. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
