Accession

FIJI

The Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has notified the Governments of the countries invited to the Stockholm Conference that the Government of Fiji deposited, on December 11, 1971, its instrument of accession dated December 1, 1971, to the Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

Fiji has fulfilled the conditions set forth in Article 14(2) of the Convention by concurrently acceding to the Stockholm Act of the Berne Convention with the declaration provided for in Article 28(1)(b)(i) of the said Act to the effect that the accession shall not apply to Articles 1 to 21 and to the Protocol Regarding Developing Countries.

Pursuant to Article 15(2), the Convention Establishing the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) will enter into force, in respect to Fiji, three months after the date of the deposit of the instrument of accession, that is, on March 11, 1972.

Joint ad hoc Group for Patent Information in Nuclear Science and Technology

(Geneva, November 5 and 6, 1971)

Note*

On the invitation of the Director General of WIPO and the Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), a Joint *ad hoc* Group for Patent Information in Nuclear Science and Technology met in Geneva at the head-quarters of WIPO on November 5 and 6, 1971.

The participants in the meeting were representatives of the IAEA, of national organizations for nuclear energy, of WIPO, of national Patent Offices and of the International Patent Institute. A list of participants appears at the end of this Note.

The purpose of the meeting was to attempt to identify possible ways and means for cooperation, between the IAEA and the national authorities of its member States responsible

for matters of nuclear energy on the one hand and WIPO and national Patent Offices (including the International Patent Institute) of its member States on the other, in the storage and retrieval of information relating to peaceful applications of nuclear energy which could be of mutual benefit.

The Group received a report from the representatives of the IAEA upon the present status of the International Nuclear Information System (hereinafter referred to as "INIS") and its need for patent information. INIS was established by the Board of Governors of the IAEA in 1969; it is a computerbased system for collecting and disseminating information on peaceful applications of nuclear energy and is based on the principles of decentralized input preparation, centralized merging and dissemination, and decentralized use of products. At present, national Centers in 41 countries, headed by INIS liaison officers, are responsible for selecting all pertinent publications — books, journal articles, reports, etc. — originating within their own countries and for classifying, indexing and abstracting these documents. This information, as recorded on a specially designed worksheet (and in some cases also in machine readable form), together with copies of the full text of non-conventional publications (i.e., other than commercially available books and journal articles: patent documents are regarded as non-conventional literature for the purposes of INIS), is sent to the INIS Center, where the information received from all national Centers as well as from 11 contributing international organizations is merged to produce magnetic tape and printed versions of the "INIS Atomindex" search tool. In addition, microfiches are prepared of: (1) abstracts of all documents included within the search file, and (2) the full text of non-conventional publications. These products are sent to the INIS national Centers and other contributors and subscribers, where they are used for search and retrieval.

INIS became operational in March 1970 with a subject scope which included approximately 25% of an estimated total of 85,000 annual items in the field. It is planned to expand the scope in January 1972 to include 50% and in January 1973 to include 100%. The enlarged scope for 1972 is envisaged to include up to 10,000 patent documents per year. "Patent documents" includes patents, inventors' certificates and published applications relating thereto.

The Group noted certain new problems connected with the inputting of patent documents to INIS; these problems included the identification, by means of the International Patent Classification or of national classification systems, of documents falling within the scope of INIS, the need to avoid unnecessary duplication of documents in the system, which could arise from including more than the necessary minimum number of members of the same patent "family," and differences in the promptness with which patent documents are made available to the public in different countries.

On the basis of the information exchanged, it was agreed that it was desirable that practical cooperation be established between the IAEA and WIPO and between INIS national Centers and Patent Offices. The aims of such cooperation would be:

(a) Action to be taken by WIPO and Patent Offices: to assist the IAEA and INIS national Centers in the identification of those categories of patent classification systems (International Patent Classification and, in so far as is necessary for obtaining patent documents, national classification systems) which correspond to the subject scope of INIS; secondly, to devise practical means of ensuring the prompt furnishing of patent documents by Patent Offices to INIS national Centers; thirdly, to advise on means of avoiding unnecessary duplication of patent documents in INIS, taking into account possible differences in information content between patent documents based on the same priority and the advantages for users of having access to documents in suitable languages;

(b) Action to be taken by the IAEA and INIS National Centers:

to assist Patent Offices in making full use of INIS as a search tool, particularly for non-patent literature; for this purpose, the IAEA will invite WIPO to send representatives, including representatives of Patent Offices, to meetings arranged for familiarizing potential users with INIS.

(c) Next Steps:

The IAEA Secretariat and the WIPO International Bureau will examine the possibility of jointly organizing a meeting

attended mainly by representatives of INIS national Centers and Patent Offices (including the International Patent Institute) to explore further ways and means of cooperation among them in order to facilitate the inclusion of patent documents in INIS and its use by Patent Offices.

It was emphasized that, in planning and carrying out the cooperation referred to above, both the IAEA and WIPO would pay particular attention to the needs of developing countries, so that the systems and methods of work would facilitate their access to technology and the transfer of technology.

Nice Union

Committee of Experts for the International Classification of the Figurative Elements of Marks

(Geneva, November 22 to 26, 1971)

Note*

On the invitation of the Director General of WIPO, a Committee of Experts for the International Classification of the Figurative Elements of Marks met in Geneva, at the head-quarters of WIPO, from November 22 to 26, 1971.

Member countries of the Nice Special Union Concerning the International Classification of Goods and Services for the Purposes of the Registration of Marks had been invited as members of the Committee. The other member countries of the Paris Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as well as Colombia — which had shown particular interest in the Classification of Figurative Elements — had been invited in

an observer capacity. Several intergovernmental and international non-governmental organizations had also been invited to send observers.

The list of participants appears at the end of this Note. The first part of the session was devoted to discussions on the diplomatic instrument which could be used as the legal framework of the Classification of Figurative Elements. These discussions were based mainly on a draft Protocol to be annexed to the Nice Agreement, which was prepared by the International Bureau of WIPO, and on the draft of an independent Agreement, prepared by the International Bureau in the course of the session as a result of suggestions made during the discussion.

With regard to the adoption of a Protocol to be annexed to the Nice Agreement or of an independent Agreement, the Director General of WIPO pointed out that the Protocol solution had the advantage of simplicity but was not perfect from the legal point of view; the adoption of an Agreement, on the other hand, would be more logical but would involve the creation of a new Union with bodies and a budget of its own, which would increase the burden on member countries, complicate the internal administration of WIPO and make ratification and accession more difficult.

In view of the fact that opinion within the Committee seemed to be divided on this question, the Director General suggested that the International Bureau prepare a twin proposal for the Vienna Diplomatic Conference in 1973, which would include both a draft Protocol to the Nice Agreement and the draft of an independent Agreement. The Committee endorsed this suggestion, and it was decided that the drafts would be sent to all member countries of the Paris Union, which would be invited to indicate their preferences before the Diplomatic Conference.

The second part of the session was devoted to the study of the draft of a Classification of the Figurative Elements of Marks. The Committee amended on several points the draft which had been submitted to it. It noted that the International Bureau intended to draft a preface to the Classification of Figurative Elements which would, in particular, recall the principles underlying the preparation of the Classification and would contain some information on its use.

PLANT VARIETIES

Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants

I. Ratification

FRANCE

The French Republic has ratified the International Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants, signed in Paris on December 2, 19611, which entered into force on August 10, 1968. The instrument of ratification was deposited on September 3, 1971, in the archives of the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, which, on the same day, notified the deposit to the Member States of the Union for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants and to the Signatory States of the Convention.

In accordance with Article 34 of the Convention, the French Government declared that the Convention would apply to the territory of the French Republic in Europe, to the Departments of Guadeloupe, Guyane, Martinique and Reunion, to the Overseas Territories of French Polynesia, New Caledonia, Saint Pierre and Miquelon, Wallis and Futuna Islands and the French Southern and Antarctic Territories.

In accordance with Article 33 of the Convention, the French Government declared that it would apply the Convention to the following genera and species included in the Annex to the Convention:

Wheat — Barley — Oats — Rice — Maize — Potatoes — Peas — Beans — Lettuce — Roses — Carnations.

The Convention will also be applied to a number of genera and species not included in the Annex to the Convention. With respect to these, France will limit the benefit of protection to nationals of Member States which protect the same genera and species, as well as to physical persons and corporate bodies having their domicile or establishment in one of these States 2.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 31(3), the Convention entered into force in respect of France thirty days after the deposit of the said instrument, that is, on October 3, 1971.

II. Accession

SWEDEN

The Government of Sweden deposited with the Government of Switzerland, on November 17, 1971, Sweden's instrument of accession to the Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants.

In accordance with Article 32(4) of the Convention, the accession will take effect thirty days after the deposit of the instrument of accession, that is, on December 17, 1971.

III. Additional Information

Since the notices on the ratification of the Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants by the United Kingdom (see Industrial Property, 1965, p. 275), the Netherlands (see Industrial Property, 1967, p. 313), Germany (Federal Republic) (see Industrial Property, 1968, p. 283) and Denmark (see Industrial Property, 1968, p. 300) do not mention the declarations given by these States, the following additional information is given:

DENMARK

1. Territorial application:

The Convention does not apply to the Faroe Islands and Greenland.

2. The following genera and species included in the Annex to the Convention have been notified in accordance with Article 33 of the Convention:

Wheat — Barley — Oats — Peas — Potatoes — Beans — Red clover.

3. National treatment with respect to genera and species not included in the Annex to the Convention:

"In the case of new plant varieties not included in the genera or species named in the list mentioned in Article 4, paragraph (3), Denmark intends to grant the benefit of protection to foreign breeders provided that they are nationals of States granting Danish breeders protection for new varieties of the same genera or species, or that they are physical persons or corporate bodies having their domicile or registered office in one of these States." (Translation)

GERMANY (Federal Republic)

1. Territorial application:

The Convention is also applicable to Land Berlin.

LEGISLATION

The Nordic Design Regulations

Introductory Note

The unified text below comprises the Danish, Finnish, Norwegian and Swedish regulations in implementation of the Nordic Design Laws, published in *Industrial Property*, 1971, p. 223.

The presentation here is the same as that adopted for the publication of the laws: where the provisions in the four regulations are identically or almost identically worded, they are set out under the heading Common in the left-hand margin of the column. In other cases the relevant country or countries have been indicated in the margin above the provision concerned. Minor differences in wording are indicated by the letters D F N S. This means that the word or words in brackets only appear in the Danish (D), Finnish (F), Norwegian (N) or Swedish (S) regulations.

Translations of the regulations were kindly provided by the Patent Offices of the Nordic countries.

A model deposited with the Patent Office in accordance with Section 10 of the Act shall be kept by the Patent Office until five years have elapsed after the expiry of the registration. - (1) These Rules shall enter into force on October 1, 1970.
- (2) Except for the limitation which follows from Section 49, third sentence, of the Act, the Rules for the Filing of Applications for Registration of Designs, etc., promulgated by Royal Decree of July 17, 1953, and amended by Royal Decree of July 26, 1963, are hereby repealed.

SWEDEN

Section 32

Designs shall be classified in accordance with a list determined by the registering authority.

Section 33

Notices in matters concerning the protection of designs shall be entered in a publication issued by the registering authority.

Section 34

A model deposited with the registering authority in accordance with Section 10 of the Design Protection Act (1970:485) shall be kept by the authority until five years have elapsed after the expiry of the registration. If the registered owner of the design has not at the end of the five-year period requested its return, the registering authority may destroy the model.

Section 35

The provisions of Sections 12 and 45 of the Design Protection Act (1970:485) shall not apply with respect to an applicant or registered owner of a design who is resident in Denmark or Norway.

Section 36

An action for cancellation of registration based on Section 4, paragraphs (i) or (ii) (a) of the Design Protection Act (1970:485) shall be brought by a prosecutor unless the King in Council for a particular case orders another authority.

Section 37

When a judgment or final decision in a case referred to in Section 16, 30, 31, 32, 35, 36, 37, 38 or 41 of the Design Protection Act (1970: 485) has gained force of law, the Court shall as soon as possible inform the registering authority thereof.

Section 38

More detailed regulations shall be drawn up by the registering authority regarding applications for registration and the processing thereof, matters concerning registered designs, the Register of Designs, and publication in matters concerning the protection of designs.

This Ordinance shall enter into force on October 1, 1970.

FRANCE

Decree Fixing the List of Plant Species

for which new plant variety certificates may be issued as well as the scope and duration of breeders' rights in the case of each plant species

(No. 71-765 of September 9, 1971)

1. — New plant variety certificates may be issued, under the conditions provided for by the Law of June 11, 1970 mentioned above 1 and its implementing decrees, for the following species: soft wheat, hard wheat, barley, oats, rice, maize, potatoes, peas, beans, lettuce, rose trees and carnations.

For these species, any foreigner who is a national of a State party to the International Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants of December 2, 1961 or who has his domicile, registered office or establishment in one of those States may obtain a new plant variety certificate under the same conditions as French nationals.

Foreigners who are not nationals of one of those States or do not have their domicile, registered office or establishment therein may obtain new plant variety certificates only under the conditions of reciprocity set out in Section 2 below.

2. — New plant variety certificates may also be issued, under the conditions provided for by the Law of June 11, 1970 and its implementing decrees, for the following species: flax, tomatoes, strawberry plants, plum trees, peach trees, pear trees, quince trees, cherry trees, apricot trees, vines and poplars.

For these species, any foreigner may obtain a new plant variety certificate provided that French nationals are accorded reciprocal protection for the said species by the State of which the foreigner is a national or in which he has his domicile or establishment.

Orders of the Minister of Agriculture and the Minister for Foreign Affairs, issued on the proposal of the Committee for the Protection of New Plant Varieties, shall determine, for each species and for each State concerned, that the legislation of that State satisfies this condition of reciprocity.

3. — For the following species: hard wheat, soft wheat, barley, oats, rice, peas, beans, lettuce, flax, maize and tomatoes, the breeders' rights shall relate to the seeds as defined in accordance with Section 1 of Decree No. 68-955 of October 29, 1968 mentioned above².

² Decree relating to the implementation of the Law of August 1, 1905 for the Prevention of Fraud in the Trade of Seeds and Seedlings.

- 4. For potatoes, the breeders' rights shall relate to the seedlings to be used for propagation of the species as defined in accordance with Section 1 of Decree No. 68-955 of October 29, 1968 mentioned above.
- 5. For poplars, the breeders' rights shall relate to the cuttings and, generally, to any part of the plant which is to be used as material for the multiplication of the variety.
- 6. For strawberry plants, the breeders' rights shall relate to the whole plant or part thereof which is to be used as material for the multiplication of the variety.
- 7. For rose trees and carnations, the breeders' rights shall relate to the whole plant or part thereof as well as to all elements for reproduction or vegetative multiplication of the variety concerned.
- 8. In the case of the following species: plum trees, peach trees, pear trees, vines, cherry trees, quince trees and apricot trees, the fruit-bearing varieties and the rootstock may be protected. The breeders' rights shall relate to any part of the plant which is to be used as material for multiplication, such as seedlings, grafts, cuttings and layers.

The rights shall also relate to the pips or stones of these species where these can be used as seed for the sexual reproduction of the varieties.

9. — The term of protection shall be twenty years for the following species: hard wheat, soft wheat, barley, oats, rice, peas, beans, lettuce, flax, maize, tomatoes, strawberry plants, rose trees and carnations.

The term shall be twenty-five years for the following species: potatoes, poplars, plum trees, peach trees, pear trees, vines, cherry trees, quince trees and apricot trees.

- 10. Any person who desires, at the time of any act of assignment, concession or commercialization of the varieties referred to in the foregoing Sections, to avail himself of the possibility under Section 9 of the Law of June 11, 1970 mentioned above to add a trademark to the variety denomination, whether he is the owner of the mark or other lawful user thereof, shall take the necessary precautions, especially in correspondence, in advertisements, in the preparation of trade catalogs and on packages or labels, to ensure that the denomination is sufficiently visible in its context so as to prevent any likelihood of confusion in the mind of the purchaser as to the variety's identity.
- 11. Orders of the Minister of Agriculture issued on the proposal of the Committee for the Protection of New Plant Varieties shall determine, when the need arises, the details of the application of this Decree, which shall enter into force on publication in the *Journal officiel* of the French Republic of the order provided for by Section 11 of the Law of June 11, 1970 mentioned above ³.
- 12. The Minister for Foreign Affairs and the Minister of Agriculture are entrusted with the implementation of this Decree, which shall be published in the *Journal officiel* of the French Republic.

SWEDEN

I

Plant Breeders' Protection Act

(No. 392 of May 27, 1971) *

General Provisions

- 1. This Act shall apply to a plant variety belonging to a plant genus or plant species designated by the King in Council.
- 2. A breeder who has bred a plant variety in Sweden, or his successor in title, may obtain through registration the exclusive right to commercialize the variety in accordance with this Act (plant breeder's right).

A breeder who is a national of Sweden or domiciled therein or his successor in title may acquire a plant breeder's right also to a variety which has been produced abroad.

To the extent deemed necessary for the fulfillment of the obligations of Sweden arising from international agreements with other countries and provided that reciprocity exists or that the matter is of substantial public interest, the King in Council may decree that a plant breeder's right may be acquired also for a variety that has been bred in a foreign State by a person who is not a Swedish national or domiciled in Sweden.

- 3. A plant variety shall be registered only if
- (i) by at least one important characteristic it clearly differs from another variety that has become known before the date of the application for registration;
- (ii) it is sufficiently homogeneous, having regard to such particular features as are determined by its sexual reproduction or vegetative propagation;
- (iii) after propagation effected in accordance with the method of propagation indicated by the breeder, it is stable in its essential characteristics.

A plant variety shall be regarded as known if material thereof has been commercially offered for sale or otherwise supplied, or if the variety has been included in, or notified for, an official list of varieties, if it appears in a reference collection accessible to the public, if it has been accurately described in written matter accessible to the public, or if it has otherwise come to the knowledge of the public.

Registration may not be made if, with the consent of the breeder or of his successor in title, plant material of the variety has been commercialized in Sweden before the date of the application for registration, or outside Sweden more than four years before the said date.

4. — A plant breeder's right means that, with the exceptions stated below, no one except the owner of the plant breeder's right (variety owner) may without the latter's permission commercialize the plant variety by

- (i) producing or importing into Sweden plant material of the variety with the aim of offering the material for sale for purposes of propagation or of otherwise supplying it for such purposes;
- (ii) offering for sale or otherwise supplying plant material of the variety for purposes of propagation;
- (iii) in cases when repeated use of the plant material is necessary for the production of plant material of another variety, using plant material of the variety for such production and with the aim of offering the produced material for sale for purposes of propagation or of otherwise supplying it for such purposes.

With respect to ornamental plants, the plant breeder's right also means that no one except the variety owner may, without the latter's permission, use plants or parts of plants as propagating materials for the commercial production of cut flowers or other materials intended for ornamentation.

5. — The King in Council may decree that an application for registration of a plant variety which has previously been mentioned in an application for protection outside Sweden shall, at the request of the applicant, be deemed for the purposes of Section 3(1)(i) and (3) to have been made at the same time as the application outside Sweden.

The decree shall specify in more detail the conditions under which such priority may be enjoyed.

The Application for Registration and Processing Thereof

6. — Registration under this Act shall be made in the Plant Variety Register which shall be kept by the National Plant Variety Board.

Upon registration of a plant variety, the denomination of the variety shall also be registered.

7. — Applications for registration of a plant variety shall be made in writing to the National Plant Variety Board.

The application shall contain a clear description of the variety, with a special statement of the characteristic or characteristics distinguishing the variety from other varieties, and a proposal or proposals for a denomination of the variety. The name of the breeder shall be stated in the application. If registration is sought by a person who is not the breeder, the applicant shall furnish proof of his right to the variety.

There shall be attached to the application document a certificate signed by the applicant attesting on his honor that the variety to his knowledge has not, before the date when the application is made or is deemed under the provisions of Section 5 to have been made, become known so as to preclude registration by virtue of Section 3(3).

When the application is made, the applicant shall supply plant material of the variety in a sufficient quantity for testing the variety.

The applicant shall pay a prescribed application fee.

8. — The variety denomination shall enable the plant variety to be distinguished from other varieties.

The variety denomination may not be approved if it

- (i) consists of figures only;
- (ii) is manifestly of such a nature as to mislead the public;

- (iii) conflicts with a law or other statutory instrument or with public order or if it is of such a nature as to give offense;
- (iv) may be confused with a variety denomination which has been entered or proposed for entry in the Plant Variety Register or other official list of varieties for the same plant or for a closely related species of plant, or which is used on propagating material of such a variety;
- (v) may be confused with a trademark, name, trade name or other designation for which a person other than the applicant enjoys protection and which would have constituted an obstacle to the registration of the variety denomination as a trademark for material of a plant variety or for goods of a similar kind;
- (vi) may be confused with a trademark for material of a plant variety or for goods of a similar kind, for which trademark the applicant enjoys protection.

Provided that reciprocity exists, the King in Council may direct that a variety denomination which is the subject of a registration or an application for registration in a foreign State may, notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), be registered in Sweden unless for special reasons this is not considered expedient.

- 9. A request may not be made in one and the same application for the registration of two or more plant varieties.
- 10. An applicant who is not resident in Sweden shall have an authorized representative domiciled in this country who is empowered to represent him in all matters concerning the application.
- 11. If the applicant has not observed the application requirements, or if there is any other obstacle to approval of the application, the applicant shall be invited in an official notice to express his views or to make a rectification within a prescribed period.

If the applicant fails within the prescribed period to submit a statement, or to take action to remedy a defect to which attention has been drawn, the application shall be cancelled. A reminder to this effect shall be included in the official notice to the applicant.

- 12. If there is still an obstacle to approval of the application after a statement has been submitted, and if the applicant has had an opportunity to express his views regarding the obstacle, the application shall be rejected, unless there are grounds for sending the applicant a further official notice.
- 13. Where anyone claims before the National Plant Variety Board to have a better right to the plant variety than the applicant, and where the matter is unclear, the Board may call upon him to institute legal proceedings within a certain period, failing which his claim will be disregarded when further consideration is given to the application.

Where a dispute concerning a better right to the variety is pending before a court of law, the application for registration may be suspended until a final judgment is pronounced in the case. 14. — Where anyone proves to the National Plant Variety Board that he has a better right to the plant variety than the applicant, the Board shall transfer the application to him if he so requests. The transferee shall pay a new application fee.

Where transfer is requested, the application may not be cancelled, rejected or approved until the request has been finally examined.

15. — Where the application documents are complete and there is no obstacle to registration, the National Plant Variety Board shall publish the application in order to give the public an opportunity to enter opposition to the application.

Oppositions shall be made in writing to the National Plant Variety Board within a period determined by the Board.

- 16. The National Plant Variety Board shall make arrangements for trials with material of the plant variety, unless for special reasons this is considered unnecessary. A prescribed fee shall be paid for the trials.
- 17. After the period for opposition to the application has expired and trials with material of the plant variety have been concluded, the application shall be taken up for further consideration. Sections 11 to 14 shall apply when such consideration is given to the application.

The applicant shall be given an opportunity of expressing his views on any opposition made and any trial carried out.

18. — An appeal against a final decision of the National Plant Variety Board on a matter concerning an application for registration of a plant variety may be made by the applicant if the decision has gone against him. A person who has duly entered opposition may appeal against a decision approving the application. Where the opponent withdraws his appeal, it may nevertheless be heard if special reasons exist.

An applicant may appeal against a decision approving a request for transfer under Section 14. A person who has submitted a request for transfer may appeal against a decision rejecting the request.

19. — Appeals in accordance with Section 18 shall be lodged with the National Board of Agriculture within two months from the date of the decision. The person who wishes to appeal shall within the same period pay a prescribed appeal fee, failing which the appeal will not be considered.

An applicant may appeal against a decision of the National Board of Agriculture if it has gone against him. The appeal shall be made to the King within two months from the date of the decision.

20. — Where an application for registration of a plant variety is approved and the decision to that effect gains force of law, the variety shall be entered in the Plant Variety Register, and the registration shall be published.

A decision to cancel or reject an application that has been published in accordance with Section 15 shall be published after the decision has gained force of law.

Period of Validity of Plant Breeder's Right

21. — A plant breeder's right shall be valid from the date when the application for registration was approved and may

be maintained in force for fifteen years, or — in the case of vines, fruit trees and their rootstocks, forest trees and ornamental trees — eighteen years, calculated from the beginning of the year immediately following the year in which the decision as to registration gained force of law.

Use of Variety Denomination

22. — A person who commercially offers for sale or otherwise supplies propagating material of the plant variety for which registration has been made shall in so doing use the denomination registered for the variety, and shall continue to use it after the protection period for the variety has expired or the plant breeder's right has otherwise lapsed.

A registered denomination of a variety or a denomination that may be confused therewith may not be used for another variety of the same or of a closely related plant species or for material of such a variety so long as the registration of the denomination continues.

Annual Fees

23. — Unless otherwise determined by the provisions of Section 49, a prescribed annual fee shall be paid for a plant breeder's right for every calendar year, calculated from the beginning of the year immediately after the year in which the application for registration was approved.

The annual fee shall fall due on the first day of the calendar year to which it relates. The annual fee for a year that has begun before the plant variety was registered, or within two months thereafter, shall not however fall due until two months after the date of the registration. The annual fee may not be paid before registration has been made, or earlier than six months before the calendar year to which the fee relates.

The annual fee may, together with a prescribed additional fee, be paid within six months after the due date.

Postchecking

24. — In order to check the stability of a registered plant variety, the National Plant Variety Board may call upon the variety owner to supply the Board with propagating material of the variety as well as with necessary documents and information.

Licenses, Transfer, etc.

25. — Where the variety owner has permitted another person to commercialize a registered plant variety (license), the licensee may not transfer his right in the absence of an agreement to that effect.

A license included in a business may however be transferred when the business or part thereof is transferred, unless otherwise agreed. In such a case the transferor shall still be responsible for ensuring that the license agreement is fulfilled.

26. — If a plant breeder's right has passed to another person or if a license has been granted or transferred, a note to that effect shall — on request and on payment of a prescribed fee — be entered in the Plant Variety Register. If it is shown that a license that has been entered in the Register has ceased to be valid, the entry shall be removed.

Subsection (1) shall apply correspondingly to a compulsory license.

In a case or matter concerning a plant breeder's right, the variety owner shall be deemed to be the person who has last been entered in the Plant Variety Register in that capacity.

- 27. If the market is not supplied with propagating material of a registered plant variety on reasonable terms and to the extent required in view of the national economy or other public interest, any person who wishes to commercialize the variety in Sweden may obtain a compulsory license for that purpose, provided that there is no acceptable reason for the failure to supply. A compulsory license shall also include the right to receive, from the variety holder, propagating material of the variety to the extent that is reasonable.
- 28. A compulsory license may be issued only to a person who may be assumed to be capable of utilizing the plant variety in an acceptable manner and in conformity with the license.

A compulsory license shall not constitute an obstacle to utilization of the variety by the variety owner himself or to the granting of a license by him. A compulsory license may not pass to another person, except together with the business in which it is utilized or in which utilization was intended to take place.

29. — A compulsory license shall be issued by the court, which shall also determine the extent to which the plant variety may be utilized, and stipulate the royalties and other terms for the license. When a substantial change in circumstances so requires, the court may, when requested to do so, cancel the license or stipulate new terms.

Termination of a Plant Breeder's Right, etc.

- 30. If an annual fee is not paid in accordance with Section 23, the plant breeder's right shall be void from the beginning of the year for which the fee has not been paid.
- 31. If a plant variety has been registered contrary to Section 1, 2 or 3(1)(i) or (3) and if the obstacle still exists, the court shall, when an action is brought on that account, annul the registration. However, registration may not be annulled on the ground that the person to whom registration was accorded is only a part owner of the plant breeder's right.

An action based on the registration of a plant variety in the name of a person who is not the person entitled thereto under Section 2 may be brought only by the person who claims to be entitled to the variety. The action shall be brought within one year after the plaintiff had knowledge of the registration and the other circumstances on which the action is based. If the variety owner acted in good faith when the variety was registered or when the plant breeder's right passed to him, the action may not be brought later than three years after the registration.

In other cases, the action may be brought by anyone who sustains damage as a result of the registration and, if the public interest so requires, by an authority designated by the King in Council.

32. — Where a plant variety has been registered in the name of a person who is not the person entitled thereto under Section 2, the court shall, when an action is brought by the

person entitled, transfer the registration to him. The action shall be brought within the period stated in Section 31(2).

33. — Where a variety owner has failed to comply with an official notice from the National Plant Variety Board under Section 24 and if such failure constitutes an obstacle to a reliable postchecking of the plant variety, the Board shall remove the variety from the Register.

Where it is found that a registered plant variety has not retained the characteristic or characteristics which, at the time of registration, distinguished the variety from other varieties, the National Plant Variety Board shall remove the variety from the Register.

34. — Where the variety owner declares in writing to the National Plant Variety Board that he renounces the plant breeder's right, the Board shall remove the plant variety from the Register.

Where a plant breeder's right is the subject of attachment or where a dispute concerning transfer of registration is pending before the court, the variety may not be removed from the Register at the request of the variety owner so long as the attachment continues or the dispute has not been finally settled.

35. — Where a variety denomination has been registered contrary to this Act and if there is still a ground precluding registration, the National Plant Variety Board shall register a new denomination for the plant variety. The same rule shall apply where the registered denomination of a variety has manifestly been of such a nature as to mislead the public or has become contrary to public order or of such a nature as to give offense.

In a case referred to in subsection (1), a variety owner shall be given an opportunity to propose a new denomination.

The registered denomination of a variety for which the protection period has expired or the plant breeder's right has otherwise lapsed may, at the request of the variety owner or for other reasons, be removed from the Plant Variety Register after the National Plant Variety Board has given consideration to the matter, provided that the denomination is no longer used.

Liability and Obligation to Provide Compensation, etc.

36. — Anyone who intentionally infringes a plant breeders' right shall be liable to a fine or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months.

Public prosecution for the offense referred to in subsection (1) may be instituted only if the aggrieved party reports the offense for prosecution and if prosecution is required for special reasons of public interest.

37. — A person who intentionally or through negligence infringes a plant breeder's right shall pay reasonable compensation for the utilization of the plant variety, as well as compensation for the further damage caused by the infringement. If the negligence is slight, the compensation may be adjusted.

If anyone infringes a plant breeder's right without intention or negligence, he shall pay compensation for the utilization of the variety, if and in so far as this is reasonable. An action for compensation for infringement of a plant breeder's right shall be brought within five years from the date upon which the damage occurred, failing which the right to compensation will be forfeited.

38. — At the request of the person whose plant breeder's right has been infringed, the court may order, in accordance with what is reasonable for the prevention of further infringement, plant material with regard to which infringement exists to be surrendered in return for payment to the person whose right has been infringed, or to be destroyed. This rule shall not apply to a person who has acquired the material or a special right thereto in good faith and who has not himself infringed the plant breeder's right.

The material referred to in subsection (1) may be confiscated if it may reasonably be assumed that an offense referred to in Section 36 has been committed. The general provisions of the law with respect to confiscation in criminal cases shall apply in these circumstances.

Notwithstanding subsection (1), the court may, if so requested, make an order giving the possessor of material referred to in subsection (1) a right of disposal over the material in return for reasonable payment and on other reasonable terms.

39. — If anyone commercializes a plant variety referred to in an application for registration, the provisions of this Act regarding infringement of a plant breeder's right shall apply correspondingly if the application leads to registration. However, no penalty may be imposed, and compensation for damage caused by utilization made before the application was published in accordance with Section 15 may be determined only in accordance with Section 37(2).

Section 37(3) shall not apply if the action for compensation is brought not later than one year after the date of registration of the plant breeder's right.

40. — Where registration of a plant variety has been annulled by a judgment that has gained force of law, no penalty or order to pay compensation may be imposed or precautionary measure enforced in accordance with Sections 36 to 39.

Where the defendant in an action for infringement of the plant breeder's right claims that the registration should be annulled, the court shall upon his request adjourn the case until the question of annulment of the registration has been finally examined. If no action is brought for this purpose, the court shall, when the case is adjourned, prescribe a certain period for the defendant to bring the action.

41. — A person who intentionally or through negligence infringes Section 22 shall be liable to a fine. He shall also provide compensation for damage caused. If the negligence is slight, no penalty shall be imposed. The compensation may in such a case be adjusted.

Rules concerning Legal Procedure

42. — A variety owner, or any person who may utilize a plant variety by virtue of a license, may bring an action for a declaratory judgment on whether he is protected by the

registration against another person where there is, to his detriment, any uncertainty as to the situation.

Under the same conditions, any person who carries on or who intends to carry on activities may bring an action against a variety owner for a declaratory judgment on whether there is any obstacle to the activity because of the registration.

Where it is claimed in a case referred to in subsection (1) that the registration should be annulled, Section 40(2) shall apply correspondingly.

43. — A person who wishes to bring an action for annulment of registration of a plant variety, for transfer of registration or for the issue of a compulsory license shall notify the National Plant Variety Board accordingly and inform everyone who according to the Plant Variety Register holds a license to utilize the variety. If a licensee wishes to bring an action for infringement of the plant breeder's right or for a declaratory judgment referred to in Section 42(1), he shall inform the variety owner accordingly.

The obligation to give information in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) shall be deemed to have been fulfilled when information in a prepaid registered letter has been mailed to the address entered in the Plant Variety Register.

If it is not shown when the action is brought that a notification has been made or information given in accordance with subsection (1), the plaintiff shall be given time for this. If he fails to act within this time, his action may not be considered.

- 44. If, under the provisions of the Judicial Procedure Code, there is no competent court of law for an action concerning a better right to a plant variety, for the annulment of registration of a variety or for transfer of such registration, for a compulsory license or for a declaratory judgment under Section 42, the action shall be brought before the Stockholm District Court.
- 45. A copy of the judgment or final decision in a case referred to in Sections 13, 29, 31, 32, 36 to 39 or 42 shall be sent to the National Plant Variety Board.

Special Provisions

46. — A variety owner who is not resident in Sweden shall have an authorized representative domiciled in this country who is empowered to accept service on his behalf of writs, summonses and other documents in cases and matters concerning a plant breeder's right, with the exception of summonses in criminal cases and of subpoenas. The authorized representative shall be notified to the Plant Variety Register and shall be noted therein.

Where a variety owner has not notified an authorized representative in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1), service may be made instead by mailing him the document that is to be served in a prepaid letter to his address entered in the Plant Variety Register. If a full address is not entered in the Register, the document may be served by publicly posting it in the premises of the National Plant Variety Board.

An announcement regarding the service shall be published in the official gazettes. The document shall be deemed to have been served when these conditions have been fulfilled.

- 47. Provided that reciprocity exists, the King in Council may decree that Section 10 or 46 shall not apply to an applicant or variety owner who is resident in a specified foreign State or who has an authorized representative domiciled in that State who has been notified to the National Plant Variety Board and who has the authority referred to in the said sections.
- 48. An appeal against a final decision of the National Plant Variety Board, in accordance with the provisions of this Act, other than an appeal referred to in Section 18, shall be lodged with the National Board of Agriculture within two months from the date of the decision. The person who wishes to appeal shall within the same period pay a prescribed appeal fee, failing which the appeal will not be considered.

An appeal against a decision of the National Board of Agriculture shall be addressed to the King and lodged within two months from the date of the decision.

- 49. Fees in accordance with this Act shall be determined by the King in Council or, with respect to fees for trials under Section 16, by an authority designated by the King in Council. When the annual fees are to be decided, the King in Council may decree that no fee shall be payable for one or more of the first years.
- 50. The King in Council may decree that a plant variety for which registration is sought may be examined by an authority in another State or by an international institution, and that an applicant for registration of a variety who has previously sought registration for the same variety in another State shall report information given to him by the authority in that State concerning the examination of the registration requirements.

This Act shall enter into force on July 1, 1971.

An application for registration of a plant variety which was included in the national variety list during the period July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1971 shall, for the purposes of Section 3(1)(i) and (3), be deemed to have been made at the same time as the entry in the national variety list, provided that an application for registration is made within six months of this Act's entry into force.

II

Extract from the Plant Breeders' Protection Ordinance

(No. 393 of May 27, 1971) *

- 1. The Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392) shall apply to plant varieties belonging to the botanical genera and species listed in the Annex to this Ordinance.
- 2. In addition to the persons mentioned in Section 2(1) and (2) of the Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392), plant breeders' rights may be granted to the following persons:
 - (i) a breeder who has bred a plant variety in a foreign State party to the Convention for the Protection of New Varieties of Plants, of December 2, 1961, hereinafter referred to as a Member State, or his successor in title;
 - (ii) a breeder who is a national of a Member State or domiciled therein and who in circumstances other than those mentioned in (i) above has bred a plant variety outside Sweden, or his successor in title.

8. — Where an application for protection of a new variety that has already been submitted for protection in a Member State is filed in Sweden within twelve months of the submission in the said Member State (priority period), the application in Sweden shall be deemed, for the purposes of Section 3(1)(i) and (3) of the Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392), to have been filed on the same date as the application in the Member State. The same shall apply if the plant variety has been submitted for protection in another country by means of an application which the National Plant Variety Board finds special reasons for equating with an application made in a Member State.

In order to benefit from the priority granted by subsection (1), the applicant must include a claim to priority in the application to the Swedish authority, and

- (i) within three months from the date of application in Sweden, present copies of the documents relating to the first application, duly certified by the authority which received that application;
- (ii) within four years from the date of expiry of the priority period, submit the additional documents and the material necessary for the determination of the question of priority.

12. — Any person who applies for protection in Sweden with respect to a plant variety which he has previously submitted for protection in another State, shall report information as to the views expressed by the authority in that State concerning the examination of the requirements for protection.

13. — A variety denomination which has been registered or submitted for registration in a Member State shall be registered in Sweden, notwithstanding Section 8(1) and (2) of the Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392), unless for special reasons this is not considered expedient.

29. — The fees provided for in the Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392) shall be the following:

Trial fees under Section 16 of the Plant Breeders' Protection Act (1971:392) shall be laid down by the National Board of Agriculture.

32. — Matters relating to plant breeders' rights shall be entered in a Gazette to be published by the National Plant Variety Board.

This Ordinance shall enter into force:

- (i) with respect to Sections 2, 8 and 13: on the date to be fixed by the King in Council;
- (ii) with respect to the other sections: on July 1, 1971.

NETHERLANDS

Report of the Octrooiraad*

With the repeal of the Trademarks Act on January 1, 1971, as a result of the entry into force on that date of the Uniform Benelux Trademark Law, the tasks entrusted to the Netherlands Trademark Office ended. 1970 was the last year in which the Office operated under the Netherlands Trademarks Act. The following is a retrospective view of the vicissitudes and activities of the Trademark Office.

The Trademark Office

The Office started its activities on December 1, 1893. Before that date there was no service entrusted with the administration of marks, unless the central register kept by the Ministry of Justice under the Trademarks Act of 1880, administering the trademarks registered at the various courts of justice, is considered as such. By an Act of 1893, the Office was entrusted with a more important task, namely the decision in first instance as to whether or not a trademark could be registered. Since, under the 1893 Act — before its amendment in 1904, the right to a mark was obtained through regis-

tration, the decisions of the Trademark Office were clearly important. The system under the 1893 Act with regard to the relationship between right and registration (not in fact a very clear system) was modified in 1904 at the expense of the value of registration. Nevertheless, registration has since then still remained a matter of importance for trademark owners. It may be assumed that about 85 % of trademarks used in the Netherlands are registered. Where they are not registered, this is often because registration is impossible due to a conflict with earlier registrations and not because it is considered valueless.

During its entire existence, the Netherlands Trademark Office registered 180,274 national trademarks; 374,225 requests for international trademarks were received under the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks, 60% of which were registered in the Netherlands. The task of examining marks, during the registration procedure, for distinctive character and lawfulness, has enabled the Office to make a substantial contribution to the rules recognized in the Netherlands in this respect; this has created a degree of clarity that does not exist in countries where the trademark administration plays a passive role in the registration procedure. Apart from its task of administering trademarks, the Office was a frequently used source of inquiry about names of manufacturers or dealers of trademarked products.

Since the Office was set up, the economic role of trademarks has become more and more important. Taking a view of early registrations, one is struck by the increase over the years in the range of products for which trademark protection is sought. Originally, a great percentage of registered trademarks concerned cigars, spirits, groceries and similar articles. Presently, all kinds of products, raw materials as well as products for the wholesale trade, are protected by trademarks. In about 1925, the strong increase in the number of trademarks, manifesting itself as early as the end of World War I, led to a radical reorganization of the search material. All trademarks registered at that time were indexed on cards, wordmarks on a lexicographical-alphabetical card-index, complemented by detailed word-ending and phonetic registers: figurative marks according to figurative mark classes, subdivided into groups according to the goods. When, after many years, this system was complete, it worked in such a way as to enable examiners to determine more speedily and with more certainty whether or not registration should be allowed. The system was used up to the end. The experience with the system enabled the Netherlands to make a substantial contribution in the 1930s to the International Classification of Goods for the Purposes of the Registration of Marks.

One may hope that the Benelux Trademark Office will continue to play, for the entire Benelux territory, the role which the Netherlands Trademark Office successfully fulfilled for Dutch trade and industry. There are good reasons to expect this to be so, since the experienced personnel of the Netherlands Trademark Office has been entirely transferred to the Benelux Trademark Office.

In the Field of Patents

In 1970 the total number of patent applications filed was 19,109, about 600 less than in 1969. It is difficult to say if this means that the growing number of patent applications since World War II will cease to increase. From the situation in other countries, it would seem that from 1970 onwards some stabilization is likely in the number of applications filed. The Octrooiraad (Netherlands Patent Office) would welcome such stabilization in view of the workload and the personnel available.

To master the burden of work, 7,000 requests for novelty search (searches into the state of the art) were entrusted to the International Patent Institute in 1970. In the same year, the Octrooiraad started implementing guidelines for a more efficient patent granting procedure, aimed at concentrating the work from the establishment of the search report up to the first decision on grant by the Application Division, for which the participation of one member or deputy member of the Octrooiraad is necessary. The number of deputy members therefore had to be increased. In 1970 the number of deputy members could not be increased beyond the maximum of 40 laid down in the Patents Rules of 1921. Since an amendment to the Rules increasing the maximum number of members and deputy members of the Octrooiraad to 90 did not come into force until December 28, the results of the new guidelines for the grant procedure were still limited in 1970.

On January 1, 1964, an amendment to the Netherlands Patents Act introduced a system enabling applicants to defer the two phases of the grant procedure (novelty search and examination) for a maximum period of seven years. In 1970 the seven-year period elapsed for a category of pending applications - those which, by January 1, 1964, had not been subjected to a novelty search and which were therefore governed by the new law. At the end of 1970, for 64.5 % of these applications a request for novelty search and for 41 % a request for examination had been filed: the number of requests for examination may slightly increase in 1971 because of the extension of the seven-year period under Section 22K of the Patents Act. These percentages confirm the prognosis about the savings that the deferred examination system would bring in comparison with the former system: according to this prognosis, 65 % of the applications would lead to a request for novelty search and 45 % to a request for examination. On the basis of these percentages, the filing of 19,000 applications a year would lead to 12,000 requests for novelty search and about 8,500 requests for examination. These amounts were not quite reached in 1970: 11,076 requests for novelty search and 6,326 requests for examination were filed.

International Activities

Members of the Octrooiraad and officers of the Ministries of Economic Affairs and Home Affairs took an active part in the preparatory work of Working Party I and of both subgroups and in the activities of Working Party III of the Intergovernmental Conference for the Setting Up of a European System for the Grant of Patents.

In relation to the projected Convention for the European Patent for the Common Market ... members of the Octrooira-ad and officers of the Ministry of Economic Affairs attended the meetings and contributed to the preparatory work.

The adoption of the Patent Cooperation Treaty was of great importance for development on the international level. The Treaty was adopted in June 1970 at a Diplomatic Conference in Washington. The Conference set up two Main Committees working simultaneously. One Committee, presided over by the United States Commissioner of Patents, dealt with the patent law aspects of the draft Treaty and Regulations. The other Committee, presided over by the President of the Octrooiraad, dealt with the political, administrative and final provisions of the Treaty. 35 countries, including the Netherlands, signed the Treaty.

The Octrooiraad followed with great interest the developments relating to the International Patent Classification as well as the work of ICIREPAT. Members of the Octrooiraad attended many international meetings.

At the invitation of his Hungarian colleague, the President of the *Octrooiraad* attended the 75th anniversary celebrations of the Hungarian Patent Office in October 1970.

During the Journées de propriété industrielle in Nice in December 1970, organized by the Nice and Montpellier Universities, the President of the Octrooiraad gave a lecture on the exhaustion of the patent right under Netherlands law. The theme: "The Exhaustion of the Patent Right" was discussed in relation to Netherlands, French, German, Italian and European law.

In 1970 fruitful discussions were held with representatives of interested circles in the Netherlands on various international developments as well as on the preparation of a revision of the national patent law. Much value is attached to discussions and cooperation with these representatives.

SWEDEN

Report of the Patent Office concerning its Activities during 1970

A new Design Protection Act came into force on October 1, 1970. This Act provides for the protection of both ornamental and utility designs in all industrial sectors. The exclusive right to use a design is acquired by registration with the Patent Office. The registration period is five years and may be renewed for two further five-year periods.

A new service program for the Patent Office has been approved. This relates to a novelty search for inventions other than in relation to patent applications.

Patent Examining Operations

The number of new applications has changed only very slightly during the last five years. It amounted to 17,858 in 1970 as compared with 18,158 in 1969. 13,515 of the applications came from abroad, 76% of the total number. The shift in the proportion of foreign and Swedish applications compared with the previous year was very slight.

In the share of applications from foreign countries, the United States of America is in the lead with 4,062 or 23% of the total number of national and foreign applications, a decrease of about 9 % over 1969. Germany (Federal Republic) occupies second place with 3,112 applications. This was a slight increase, bringing the figure up to about 17% of the total. Next comes the United Kingdom with 1,276, Switzerland with 971, France with 729, the Netherlands with 658 and Japan with 567. Apart from what has been said, no major changes have been noted in the number of applications from different countries. The increase in the number of patent applications processed, which started in 1960 and continued throughout the decade, also continued in 1970. The number of cases disposed of was 23,266, which is about 2,500 above the 1969 production figure and which exceeds the number of new applications in 1970 by 5,400. The backlog decreased in consequence. The total number of applications pending at the end of the year was 56,765. A decrease in the backlog is expected also in the next few years though on a more limited scale.

An expansion of the Office's information activities was initiated in 1969. These consist inter alia of a novelty search, carried out by the Patent Department's examiners, in the case

of inventions having no connection with patent applications. During 1970 a decision was taken to extend this service. The library facilities to the public have also been increased. An enlarged publication activity was started on January 1, 1971. From that date abstracts of patent applications are published after 18 months counted from the applications' priority dates.

Trademark and Design Examining Operations

The number of trademark applications was 5,803, which is some 100 less than in 1969, but as much above the mean annual figure for the five-year period 1966-1970. Of these about 65% or 3,744 came from abroad — almost 1,000 from the United States of America and a little over 600 from Germany (Federal Republic). The number of applications disposed of and trademarks registered was higher than ever before. A total of 6,191 applications were thus decided, of which 4,239 or 68% old led to registration.

A computerized similarity search system has been applied since the beginning of 1970. Experience with the system is encouraging. Supplementary manual examination is however maintained on a limited scale. Such a combination of mechanical and manual examination has proved to be both practical and economically advantageous.

Since the Design Protection Act came into force on October 1, 1970, a considerable increase in design applications has occurred; 1,430 applications had been filed by July 1, 1971. It is however as yet too early to say whether the interest in the protection of designs under the new Act will correspond to the long-range calculations, where the number of annual applications is expected to reach 4,000 in four or five years' time.

Appeals

The high rate of patent appeals continued during 1970. Thus the Board of Appeals received 1,319 patent cases in 1970 as against 1,336 in 1969. The most significant trend of the year is the marked increase in the number of appeals decided. In 1970 this number rose to 1,008, i.e. by nearly 25 %. This is partly due to the reinforcement by temporary members and other extra staff. The backlog was 2,196 at the turn of the year, which is a slight increase over the previous year.

The number of appeals in trademark cases is small. It was 233 in 1970.

International Cooperation

Since the Plan for Nordic Economic Cooperation has been postponed, the question of bringing into force the Nordic patent applications system has become of little actual interest. The collaboration between the Nordic Patent Offices continues, however, for solving the problems of practice arising in connection with the new Nordic Patent Laws.

Cooperation with Germany (Federal Republic) and the United States of America in the exchange of results of patent examinations continued in the same manner as in 1969.

The Swedish Patent Office was represented in the Swedish Delegation to the Diplomatic Conference in Washington concerning the PCT-plan. Sweden has also signed the Treaty. In consultation with other Nordic countries, a study has been initiated on the possibility of the Swedish Patent Office taking an active part as an International Authority under the PCT.

In the Intergovernmental Conference for the Setting Up of a European System for the Grant of Patents, members of the staff of the Swedish Patent Office have played an active part both in the Conference as such, and in its different working parties.

The Swedish Patent Office has participated actively in the work of ICIREPAT and was represented in the meetings of the various committees during the year. Sweden is a member of the Technical Coordination Committee. ICIREPAT has requested the Swedish Patent Office to develop a search system for radar. This work is under preparation at the Office.

Financing

Ever since the Patent Office was established in 1885, the principle has been maintained that its activities should be financed by the fees received from those who utilize its services. The receipts for the fiscal year 1969/70 from the patent examining, technical information and documentation, trademark and design services were Sw. Cr. 29,578,000 and the disbursements were Sw.Cr. 23,107,000. There was thus a surplus from these activities of Sw.Cr. 6,471,000.

Personnel

The personnel of the Patent Office numbered 619 on December 31, 1970. Of these 207 were engineers, 55 lawyers and 5 librarians.


