

1. Total applications worldwide







2. Percentage shares of IP filing activity by region





# Distribution of Global Patenting has Shifted in Recent Decades




- 2018 was a record year for accessions to WIPO administered treaties – reaching the highest rate of accessions in ten years
- The majority of accessions were to copyright treaties





- Madrid System

  - +6.4% over 2017
- Hague System
  - 5,404 applications (19,296 designs)
  - +3.7% over 2017 (-0.7% designs)
- Priorities

  - Comprehensive IT environments


## Trend in PCT filings




## PCT Filings by origin – top 10 origins




## Share of PCT filings






## Madrid applications for the top 10 origins



Subject Matter WIPO Center ADR Disputes (cumulative through 2018)




#### 2018 results

- 60 arbitration, mediation and expert determination <u>cases</u> (+15%)
- Parties from 23 countries
- Additional 95 requests for WIPO 'Good Offices' for existing disputes (+13%)
- Cumulative total arbitration, mediation and expert determination filing: 595
- Example <u>areas of dispute</u> in 2018: patent licenses, R&D agreements, trademark co-existence agreements, distribution agreements, software agreements, film coproduction agreements and consortium agreements
- Launch of voluntary WIPO Mediation Pledge for IP and Technology Disputes



#### 2018 results

- Record 3,447 WIPO UDRP-based cases (+12%), 5,655 domain names
- Parties from 109 countries, 318 panelists appointed from 54 countries, 19 languages of proceedings
- Many cases including allegations of counterfeit sales, fraud and phishing
- <u>Cumulative total</u> since 1999: 42,500+ WIPO UDRP-based cases for 78,500+ domain names
- <u>76 ccTLDs</u> (country code Top-Level Domains) designating WIPO dispute resolution
  - 15% of WIPO 2018 caseload
  - 2018 additions: .AI (Anguilla), .GE (Georgia), and .PY (Paraguay)
  - Significantly expanded posted party resources for ccTLD disputes






# Composition of 2018 Revenue on an IPSAS basis (millions of Swiss francs)






## Global Innovation Index 2018 – Worldwide Engagement




**Share of Voice** GII articles vs. articles on WEF Competitive Index and TI Corruption Index increased significantly 17%

### WIPO Academy's Record (1998-2018)

- 518,325 individuals have followed our distance learning courses since 2001
- **10,412 specialized courses** have been organized with our Member States for over 4,300 government officials since 2000
- **1,595 students** have graduated from our Joint Master's Program since 2003, of whom 695 received scholarships as government officials
- Five national IP training centers have been established, and 138 trainers have been certified.
- More than 3,355 participants have taken part in the WIPO Summer Schools since 1998

- WIPO Connect
  - Supports the business operations of Collective Management Organizations (CMOs) in the Digital marketplace
  - Deployed in 7 pilot CMOs (4 in Africa, 2 in Asia, 1 in Caribbean) at the end of 2018
- Technology and Innovation Support Centers (TISCs)
  - Over 750 in 78 national networks in developing and least-developed countries
- Public-Private Partnerships on Access to Information and Knowledge
  - ARDI
    - part of UN partnership "Research4Life" with free/affordable access to 28,000 science and technology books/journals

#### Platform of exchange of judicial information and practices on IP

- Intellectual Property Judges Forum
  - Inaugural meeting in Geneva, November 7 to 9, 2018
  - 119 judges from 64 countries from across all regions
  - 33 judges participated as moderators or panelists
  - Next Forum: November 13 to 15, 2019

#### Strengthened judicial capacity building

- Master Class on IP Adjudication
  - o August 21 to 23, 2018: in collaboration with the Supreme People's Court of China in Beijing, China
  - o 31 judges from 15 countries, including 5 members of the WIPO Advisory Board of Judges







  - o sharing intellectual property with the global health research community
  - o catalyzing and fostering global health collaborations, and
  - contributing to capacity building in developing countries
- 148 agreements established among members, of which 55 are active















