Romeo Santos works both in Academe and Industry. He practices evaluation and research in socio-urban development, sustainable environment and building technology and industry, among other fields. In 2009, he was a Fulbright Scholar and Visiting Professor at Florida Atlantic University, USA. In 2008, through a World Bank Grant, he took an advanced study on International Development Evaluation in Carlton University, Canada. He also finished an advanced course on Shelter and Development in Lund University, Sweden in 2007, sponsored by Sida.
