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## PROTOCOL RELATING TO THE MADRID AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION OF MARKS

## **Individual Fees under Article 8(7): Georgia**

1. In accordance with Rule 35(2)(c) of the Common Regulations under the Madrid Agreement and Protocol, the Director General has, at the request of the Office of Georgia, established the following new amounts, in Swiss francs, of the individual fee that is payable when Georgia is designated, either in an international application or in a designation subsequent to international registration, or in respect of the renewal of an international registration in which Georgia has been designated:

2. This change will take effect on August 1, 2000. Therefore, these fees will be payable where Georgia

(a) is designated in an international application which is received, or is deemed to have been received under Rule 11(1)(c), by the Office of origin on or after that date, or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation which is received by the Office of origin or another interested Office on or after that date, or is filed direct with the International Bureau on or after that date, or

(c) has been designated in an international registration which is renewed on or after that date.
