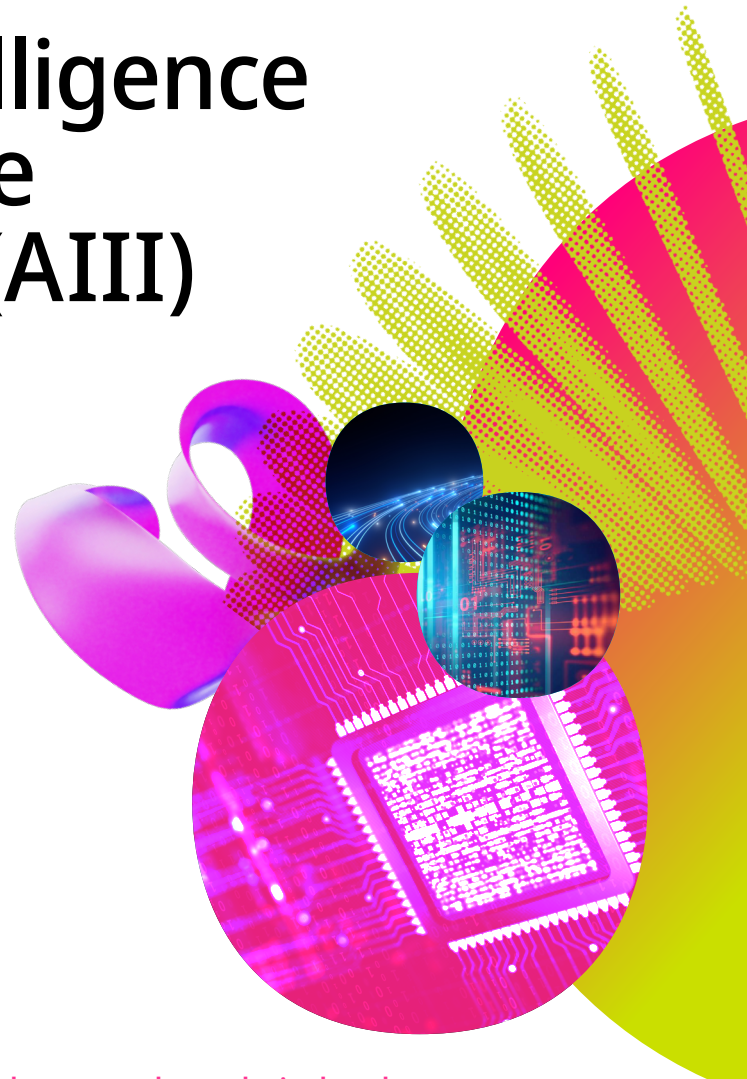




Artificial Intelligence Infrastructure Interchange (AIII)



WIPO initiative that facilitates global dialogue on the technical and operational aspects of the intellectual property system in the context of artificial intelligence

About the Artificial Intelligence Infrastructure Interchange (AIII)

AIII is a new forum that gathers technical experts from the private sector from around the world to facilitate dialogue on the technical and operational aspects of the intellectual property system in the context of artificial intelligence. AIII recognizes that the impact of AI on the IP ecosystems has both policy and operational aspects and that it is important to create an avenue to discuss the latter, while ongoing policy discussions proceed. Policy frameworks ultimately need to be supported by practical, workable technical solutions, standards and tools. And fostering dialogue about those elements of “IP infrastructure” is critical in this moment.

AIII does not set policy or legal standards. Instead, it focuses on how technical systems and tools can effectively support creators, copyright owners, and innovators while also promoting the development of AI technology in a rapidly evolving environment.

What kind of questions will AIII explore?

While these may evolve over time, discussions could include:

- Practical and technical considerations such as approaches to identifying and managing AI-generated outputs, identifying human and AI contributions to works or innovations; and
- The potential role of technical tools, such as watermarking, in supporting the implementation of policy decisions.

What will AIII look like?

To support the detailed, technical-level discussions envisioned for AIII, the initiative is establishing a Technical Exchange Network, comprising technical experts from the private sector – such as tech companies, AI developers, rightsholders, individual creators – academia, and civil society.

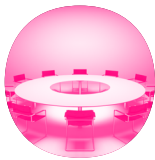
The work will proceed through a series of members-only meetings to account for the need to provide a trusted, constructive environment.

How will transparency to and engagement by Member States be safeguarded?

The results and status of the Technical Exchange Network meetings will be shared during a one-day annual public meeting, which will provide space for Member States and other stakeholders to stay informed and give input through interventions

Moreover, if there is interest from Member States, we will form a Government Expert Group that can meet periodically to exchange on national initiatives at the intersection of AI and IP infrastructure issues.

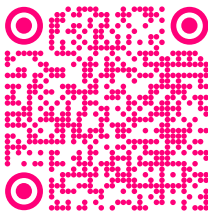
