Key insights

- Intangible investment in the Philippines reached USD 49.1 billion in 2022.
- In the last year (2021–2022), intangible investment grew at 4.6 percent while tangible investment grew at 10.2 percent.
- Over the past decade for which data are available (2012–2022), intangible investment in the Philippines grew at a real rate of 3.9 percent per year, compared to 7.2 percent recorded for tangible investment.
- Intangible investment in the Philippines makes up 4.4 percent of GDP in 2022, while tangible investment makes up 20 percent.
- The Philippines' fastest-growing intangible asset type was research & development (R&D), growing at 20.1 percent between 2012–2022 in real terms, followed by software & databases (18.3 percent) and other intellectual property (IP) products (10.8 percent).
- Investment in organizational capital makes up the largest share (48 percent) of the Philippines' total intangible investment in 2022, followed by brands (29 percent) and software & databases (9 percent).
- 83.3 percent of the Philippines' total intangible investment goes unmeasured in official statistics, as of 2022.

Share of GDP, 2010–2022

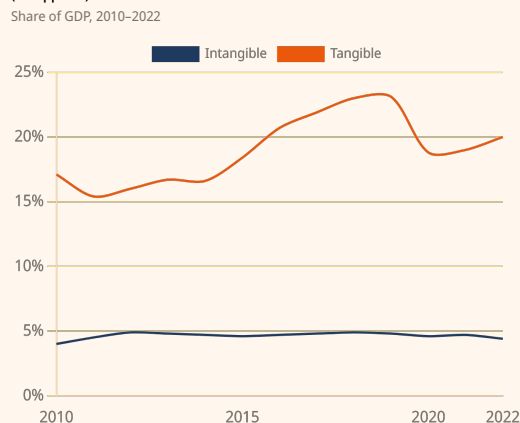


Figure 2: Intangible versus tangible investment growth (Philippines)
Indexed 2012 = 100, latest 10-year period available

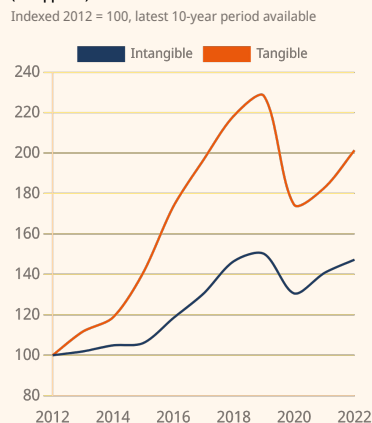


Figure 3: Real growth of intangible & tangible investment (Philippines)
10-year CAGR, 2012–2022

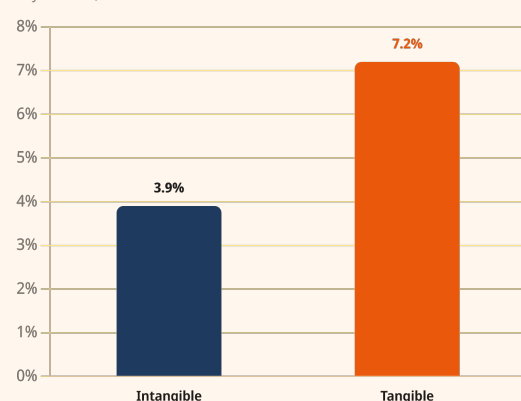


Figure 4: Real growth by asset type (Philippines)
10-year CAGR, 2012–2022

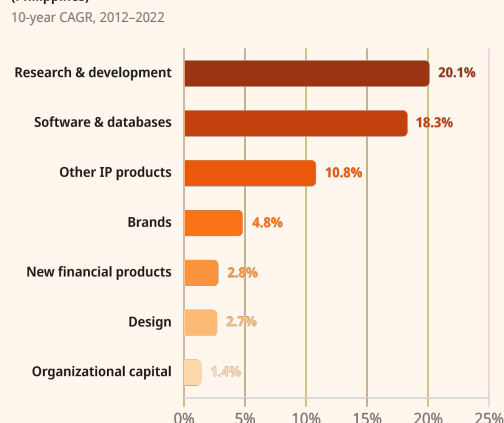


Figure 5: Intangible asset composition (Philippines)
Share of intangible investment, 2022

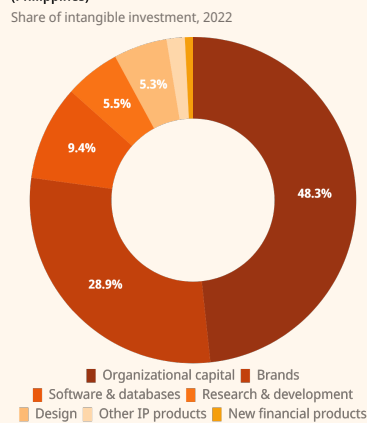
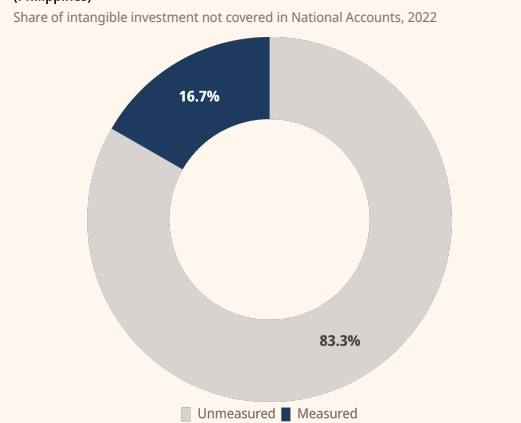


Figure 6: Measured versus unmeasured intangible investment (Philippines)

Absolute levels, latest available year for all countries (2025), except JP (2024) — in USD billions

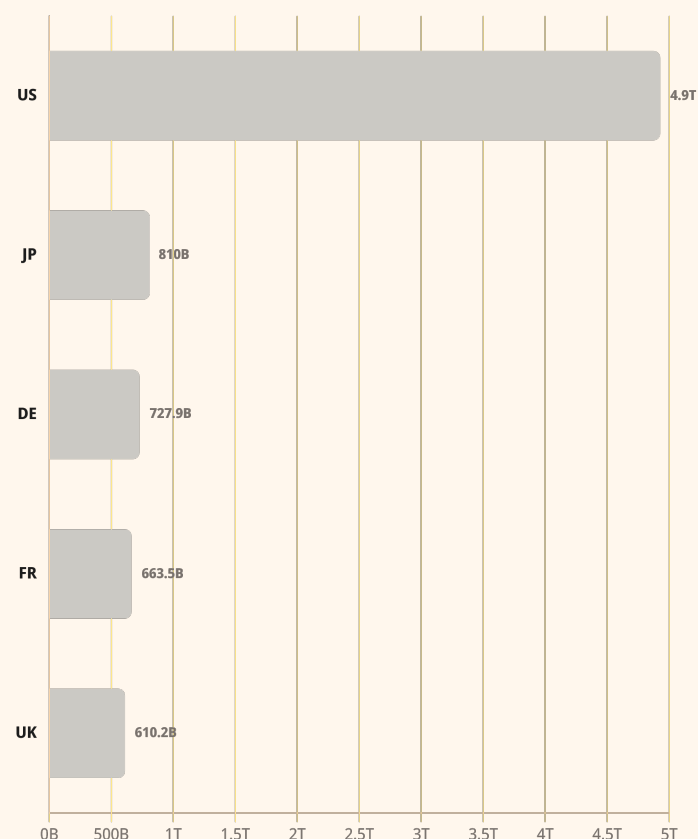


Figure 8: Remaining economies by intangible investment

Absolute levels, latest available year for all countries (2025), except BR (2023), CA (2024), IND (2023), and PHL (2022) — in USD billions

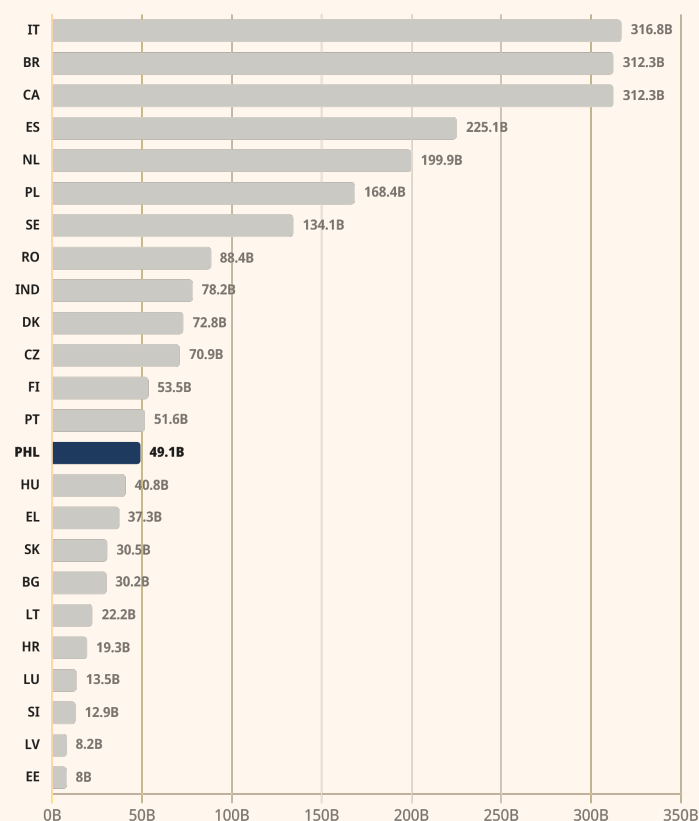


Figure 9: Intangible investment intensity

Share of GDP, latest available year

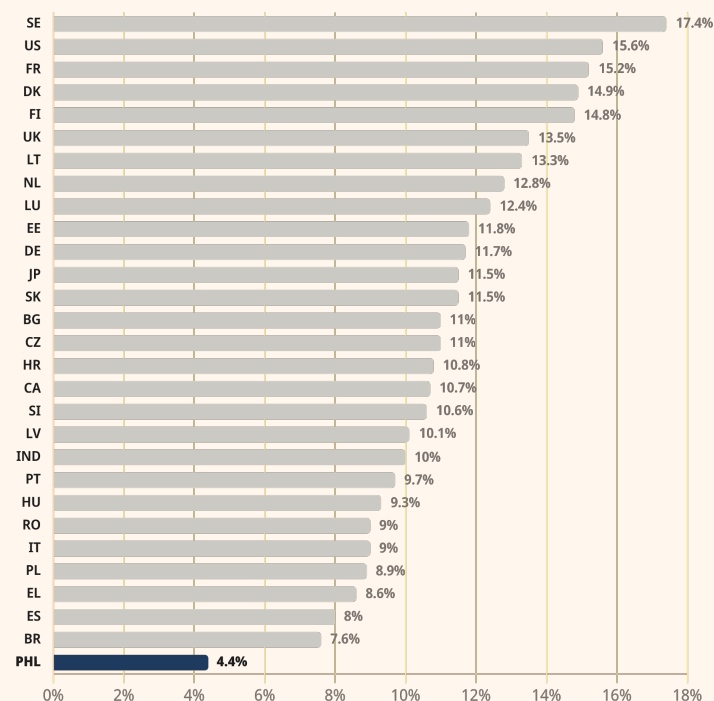
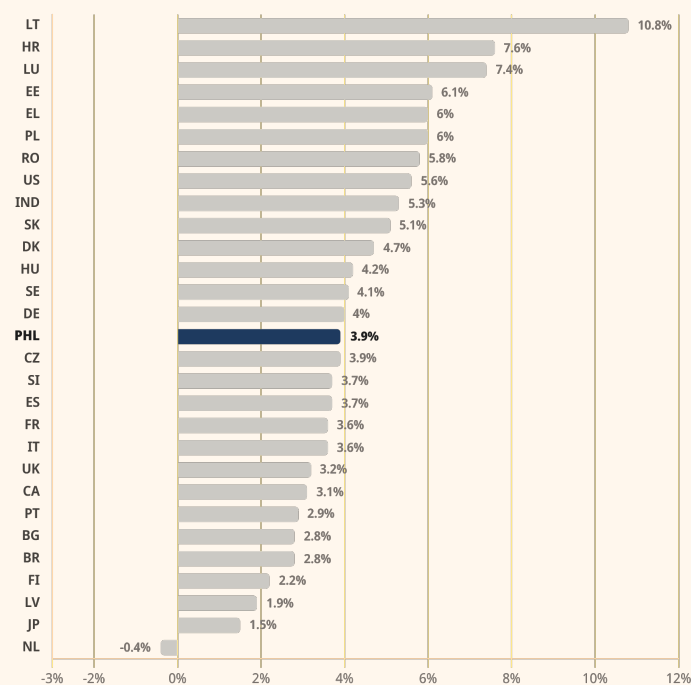


Figure 10: Real growth of intangible investment

Notes: All estimates are based on the most recent data available—2025 for all economies, with the exception of Brazil (2023), Canada (2024), India (2023), Japan (2024) and the Philippines (2022). All investment levels are expressed in purchasing power parity-adjusted current prices. Compound annual growth rates (CAGRs) in Figures 3, 4 and 10 are computed using investment data in chain-linked volume terms to reflect real growth. Investment intensities in Figures 1 and 9 are measured as a share of GDP, where GDP is proxied by “adjusted” value-added i.e. taking into account the full set of intangibles. In Figure 9, shares for India are based on formal sector GDP only; comparable estimates for Brazil and the Philippines are not yet available and are under development for future editions.
