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PROTOCOL RELATING TO THE MADRID AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION OF MARKS

Individual Fees under Article 8(7): United Kingdom

1. The United Kingdom has made a declaration under Article 8(7) of the Madrid Protocol the effect of which is to reduce the individual fee payable when the United Kingdom is designated under the Protocol either in an international application or in a designation subsequent to international registration, or in respect of the renewal of an international registration in which the United Kingdom has been designated. The new amounts are the following:

Designation fee (in the international application or in a subsequent designation): – for one class of goods or services – for each additional class	CHF 444 124
Renewal fee: – for one class of goods or services – for each additional class	CHF 494 124

2. This change will take effect on October 1, 1998. Therefore, these fees will be payable where the United Kingdom

(a) is designated in an international application which is received, or is deemed to have been received under Rule 11(1)(c), by the Office of origin on or after that date, or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation which is received by the Office of origin or another interested Office on or after that date, or is filed direct with the International Bureau on or after that date, or

(c) has been designated in an international registration which is renewed on or after that date.
