

Madrid Protocol Concerning the International Registration of Marks

Declaration made under Article 8(7)(a) of the Madrid Protocol: Saudi Arabia

1. The Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has received from the Government of Saudi Arabia the declaration referred to in Article 8(7)(a) of the Madrid Protocol, whereby Saudi Arabia wishes to receive an individual fee where it is designated in an international application, in a designation subsequent to an international registration and in respect of the renewal of an international registration in which Saudi Arabia has been designated (instead of a share in the revenue produced by the supplementary and complementary fees).

2. In accordance with Rule 35(2)(b) of the Regulations under the Madrid Protocol, the Director General of WIPO has, after consultation with the Office of Saudi Arabia, established the following amounts, in Swiss francs, of the said individual fee:

Application or Subsequent Designation	– for each class of goods or services	1,397
	<i>Where the mark is a collective or certification mark:</i> – for each class of goods or services	1,719
Renewal	– for each class of goods or services	1,397
	<i>Where payment is received within the period of grace:</i> – for each class of goods or services	1,612

3. This declaration shall have effect on October 8, 2026. Therefore, the above-mentioned amounts will be payable where Saudi Arabia

(a) is designated in an international application received by the Office of origin on or after that date; or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation received by the Office of the Contracting Party of the holder or filed directly with the International Bureau of WIPO on or after that date;
or

(c) has been designated in an international registration renewed on or after that date.
