

Madrid Protocol Concerning the International Registration of Marks

Change in the Amounts of the Individual Fee: Bahrain

1. In accordance with Rule 35(2)(d) of the Regulations under the Madrid Protocol, the Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has established new amounts, in Swiss francs, of the individual fee that is payable when Bahrain is designated in an international application, in a designation subsequent to an international registration and in respect of the renewal of an international registration in which Bahrain has been designated.
2. As from April 12, 2026, the amounts of the individual fee payable in respect of Bahrain will be the following:

3. These new amounts will be payable where Bahrain
 - (a) is designated in an international application received by the Office of origin on or after April 12, 2026; or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation received by the Office of the Contracting Party of the holder or filed directly with the International Bureau of WIPO on or after that date;
or

(c) has been designated in an international registration renewed on or after that date.
