To summarize the proposal for change:

- the main objective of this proposal for change is to introduce DOCX OOXML as an (optional) electronic document format for documents in electronic form that are prepared or exchanged under the PCT in accordance with Annex F, notably for the filing of the international application with any receiving Office which decided to accept such document format (Applicant to Office sector);
- any receiving Office which decided to accept international applications in the DOCX OOXML format would, after receipt of the application, convert the application from the DOCX OOXML format into the XML format referred to in Section 3.1.1.1 (including any images as references);
- the receiving Office would send both the DOCX OOXML file and the converted XML format file to the International Bureau in the record copy package. All further processing (including international search and international publication) would be carried out on the basis of the converted XML file, in the same way as is done at present for applications originally filed in that XML format; and,
- the second objective of this change proposal is to introduce PNG as an additional optional image file format. PNG would be treated in exactly the same way as JPEG/JFIF at present; that is, Offices would be permitted to accept images in this format, but the images would (for the moment) subsequently be converted to monochrome TIFF.

While this proposed change to permit PNG as an additional optional image file format is not consequential on the proposed inclusion of DOCX OOXML as an electronic document format for the filing of international applications, it would appear useful to introduce such change simultaneously, as PNG is one of the most commonly used file formats for general purposes at present and applicants may not always be aware of the specific file formats of images which are embedded within a DOCX OOXML file.

The following items have been extracted from the track changes change markup of Annex F provided by EPO as the substantive changes; there are a number of further editorial changes that have also been made in relation to the naming of JPEG/ JFIF and the numbering of sections; these changes are not fully reflected here, but can be found in the track changes document also provided.

communication sector, receiving Offices shall notify the International Bureau whether they will accept documents in this format. In order to accommodate Offices that do not accept documents in Office Open XML format, any Office that chooses to accept documents in this format must also convert the documents (that is, text, tables, formulas and drawings) to XML format as specified in 3.1.1.1 (in line with WIPO Standard ST36) and transmit the documents in both formats to the International Bureau.

For the Office-Office communication sector, Offices receiving DOCX OOXML from the applicant shall convert the documents to XML format as specified in 3.1.1.1 and use this converted XML for transmitting to other Offices in addition to the DOCX OOXML within the applicant's package.

3.1.1.2.1 Application document

Any file in this format, if present, must be included as a referenced document. Any DOCX OOXML file used in filing an application shall contain only features that are supported by the XML features allowed for description, claims, abstract and drawings by the DTD specified for the application-body (application-body.dtd) in appendix I; this ensures that any such file is transformable into an XML document conforming to that DTD without the need for page images.

In particular, all documents in DOCX OOXML format must meet the following requirements:

(a) Office Open XML marked up according to the strict variant of OOXML for the category of "wordprocessing" (ISO/IEC 29500-1:2008-2016 Standard);

(b) The headings and sections within the application document must adhere to the Common Application Format (CAF) standard using a paragraph style that adheres to the Office Open XML naming standards, as follows:

- Paragraphs including compliant paragraph numbering as specified in 3.1.1.1.1
- Titles of the main sections of the application as specified in 3.1.1.2.2
- Description sub-sections as specified in 3.1.1.2.2 (recommended)
- Claim lists as specified in 3.1.1.2.2
- Figure lists as specified in in 3.1.1.2.2
- Reference numbers



