

## Call for Applications for the WIPO Global Awards

The 2025 edition of the WIPO Global Awards is now open for applications until 31 March 2025. Launched in 2022, the Global Awards recognize businesses who use IP rights not only for their own success, but also as a catalyst to drive economic growth and make a positive impact on society.

The competition is free of charge and open to small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and startups including university spinouts from



all industries in WIPO's 193 Member States. SMEs and startups having used the PCT System to seek patent protection are specifically encouraged to consider applying for the WIPO Global Awards.

An independent jury of experts will select ten winning enterprises, which will be announced during an awards ceremony in July 2025. Winners will receive mentorship, exclusive access to WIPO resources, global visibility, and access to networking events in Geneva, Switzerland (travel expenses covered).

## **Exceptional Non-working Days**

#### **United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO)**

The USPTO has notified the International Bureau that it was not open to the public for the transaction of official business on 6 and 7 January 2025 due to inclement weather conditions.

Furthermore, the Office was not open on 9 January 2025 due to the designation of that day as a National Day of Mourning.

It is recalled that, pursuant to PCT Rule 80.5, if the expiration of any period during which any document or fee in connection with an international application was required to reach an Office fell on a day on which the Office is not open to the public for the purposes of the transaction of official business, that period is extended so as to expire on the next subsequent business day.

# **PCT Information Update**

#### International filing fee and handling fee payable in US dollars (various Offices)

On 1 April 2025, there will be changes in the equivalent amounts in USD of the international filing fee, the fee per sheet over 30, the electronic filing reductions (where applicable) listed in item 4 of the Schedule of Fees and the handling fee, as indicated in the PCT Fee Tables. These changes have been reflected in the following annexes of the *PCT Applicant's Guide* (www.wipo.int/pct/guide/en/):

#### **CU Cuba (fees; information relating to power of attorney)**

The Cuban Industrial Property Office has notified the International Bureau (IB) of changes in the conditions for reduction of the national filing fees for patents and utility models with effect since 17 May 2021, as follows:

fees are reduced by 40% where the applicant is a natural person or a public university.
 Annual fees from the third annuity are reduced by 50% where the applicant is a natural person or a public university.

Furthermore, the Office has notified a change in the conditions for exemptions, reductions or refunds of national fees with effect from the same date – in addition to the reduction for applications filed both on paper and in electronic form, national fees are reduced by 40% where the applicant is a natural person or a public university and annual fees from the third annuity are reduced by 50% where the applicant is a natural person or a public university.

The Office has also clarified that, relating to its requirements under PCT Rules 90.4(b) and/or 90.5(a)(ii), it requires that a separate power of attorney or a copy of a general power of attorney be submitted

# EA Eurasian Patent Organization (fees; discontinuance of use of fax machine; provisional protection; number of copies of the international application)

the relevant provisions include Article 9(3) of the Eurasian Patent Convention and
 Rules 10 and 66(2) of the Patent Regulations under the Eurasian Patent Convention.

Furthermore, the Office, as receiving Office, has notified the IB that, for international applications filed on paper, it now requires only one copy of the international application, instead of three.

# IR Iran (Islamic Republic of) (languages accepted for the filing of international applications)

The Intellectual Property Center (Islamic Republic of Iran), in its capacity as receiving Office, has notified the IB that, pursuant to PCT Rule 12.1(a), it will accept Farsi, in addition to English, as a language in which the international application may be filed with effect from 15 May 2025.

It is recalled that if the language in which the international application is filed is not accepted by the ISA, the applicant will have to furnish a translation (PCT Rule 12.3).

Furthermore, with effect from the same date, the Office will accept language-dependent free text in English or Farsi, for the filing of the sequence listing part of the description under PCT Rule 12.1(d). The Office also permits the language-dependent free text to be filed in both English and Farsi within a single sequence listing.

#### JP Japan (ISA competency)

#### **Practical Advice**

#### Time limits and possibilities of extension

Q: When the receiving Office invites me to correct formal defects, it usually sets a two-month time limit for me to respond and is willing to extend this time limit at my request. Why, then, will it not extend other time limits such as the time limit to correct a priority claim?

A: Whether a time limit fixed in the PCT Regulations can be extended is usually contained in the relevant Rule itself. For example, in the case of formal defects as you describe in the question, where for instance a receiving Office identifies physical defects in the drawings and invites the applicant to correct them, PCT Rule 26.2 states that the receiving Office may extend the time limit indicated in the invitation at any time before taking a decision on the matter. Still, the Receiving Office Guidelines state in paragraph 155

(https://www.wipo.int/pct/en/texts/ro/ro153\_159.html#\_153) that when fixing a time limit or when granting an extension of a time limit the receiving Office must take into account "the fact that corrections which may be relevant for the international search are needed by the International Searching Authority before the establishment of the international search report and that all corrections must reach the International Bureau before completion of the technical preparations for international publication."

For some situations, the Regulations provide that a fee or document must be received within a specified time limit but that even if received late, the fee or document concerned will be considered to have been timely received as long as they are received before a particular event. For example, while you have just one month to pay the transmittal fee, the international search fee and the international filling fee, PCT Rule 16*bis*.1(d) provides that, if the receiving Office receives the fees before inviting you to pay with a late payment fee (Form PCT/RO/133), the fees will be considered to have been received in time. The same principle applies where the applicant is invited to pay within a further month, with a late payment fee, but fails to do so. Any late payment received before the receiving Office has notified the applicant that the application is considered withdrawn, is considered as being timely received. It is worth noting that receiving Offices are expected to take a decision promptly after expiration of the applicable one month, in particular to avoid an application being considered withdrawn after the completion of technical preparations for international publication.

Most PCT time limits fixed in the PCT Regulations are not, however, extendible. For example, the time limit to pay additional fees where the International Searching Authority (ISA) has found that the requirement of unity of invention has not been complied with cannot be extended. PCT Rule 40.1(ii) stipulates that this time limit is only one month from the invitation. The underlying reason for this is that such invitations delay the international search procedure, and the ISA must generally complete it within the time limit of PCT Rule 42, that is, in time for the applicant to obtain the search results and to decide whether to let the application be published or whether to withdraw it in order to prevent international publication.

A further example, as you state, is for the correction or addition of a priority claim. The time limit is fixed in PCT Rule 26*bis*.1 and is designed to enable correct or added priority claims to be reflected in the international publication. It is important then that that time limit not go beyond the time of completion of technical preparations for international publication. However, it should be noted that in the case of a correction of a priority claim, if the International Bureau or receiving Office receives the notice of correction after the time limit but before it declares that the priority claim is considered void (and not later than one month after the expiration of the

time limit), the request for correction will still be considered to have been received on time in accordance with PCT Rule 26*bis*.2(b) (note that this applies only to the correction of a priority claim and not to the addition of one). Nevertheless, it is important to check, immediately after filing, that the indications relating to priority claims have been correctly indicated and, when you receive Form PCT/IB/301 (Notification of Receipt of Record Copy), check that the priority information is correctly reflected, in order to have time to request correction if that is necessary.

Despite the limited possibilities for extending time limits as explained above, the PCT provides several general safeguards to excuse delays in meeting time limits in particular circumstances such as *force majeure* events. For more information, please consult the Practical Advice in *PCT Newsletter* Nos. 03/2020 and 05/2020.

# **PCT Fee Tables**

#### (amounts on 1 February 2025, unless otherwise indicated)

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filling fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 5.189. A 90% reduction in the international filling fee (including the fee per sheet over 30), the supplementary search handling fee and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—refer to footnotes 2 and 14. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
