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PCT Filings in 2024

In 2024, PCT filings increased by 0.5% over 2023, totaling 273,900. China continued to be the largest origin of PCT filings, with 70,160 applications filed (0.9% growth over 2023), followed by the United States of America (U.S.), with 54,087 applications (-2.8%). The third, fourth and fifth rankings were again held by Japan (48,397, -1.2%), the Republic of Korea (23,851, +7.1%) and Germany (16,721, -1.3%), respectively. The top 10 countries of origin, followed by their respective percentage share of all PCT filings in 2024, were as follows:

Beyond the top 10, Finland (#14) saw strong growth (2,004 applications, +30.1%) in PCT filings.

It is important to note that total filing numbers above, as well as the filing figures which follow, are provisional because not all PCT applications that were filed with national and regional Offices in 2024 have been received at the International Bureau, and the final figures for filings will only be available later in the year.

China-based telecommunications company Huawei Technologies remained the top PCT applicant for the eighth year running, with 6,600 applications published in 2024, followed by

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Samsung Electronics of the Republic of Korea (4,640), Qualcomm of the U.S. (3,848), LG Electronics of the Republic of Korea (2,083) and Contemporary Amperex Technology of China (1,993). Among the top 10 applicants, Samsung Electronics recorded the most significant increase (+18.2%) in the number of published applications in 2024 while, outside the top 10 applicants, US tech giants Apple (up nine positions from 2023) and Google (up five positions from 2023) both entered the top 20. At least eight of the top 20 applicants operate in the mobile phone and telecommunications sectors.

In terms of filings by educational institutions, the University of California maintained its position held since 1993 as the largest user of the PCT System with 519 published applications in 2024.

The top 10 list consists of six universities from the U.S., two universities from China, and one university each from the Republic of Korea and Singapore. For more detailed information on PCT filings by educational institutions, please refer to Annex 3 of the press release.

Computer technology, which has accounted for the largest share of published PCT applications every year since 2019, was surpassed by digital communication which became the top-ranking field of technology with 10.5% of the total in 2024. It was followed by computer technology (9.7%), electrical machinery (8.6%), medical technology (6.5%), and measurement (4.4%). Only three of the top 10 technologies recorded growth in 2024, with digital communication (+9.9%) reporting the fastest rate of growth, followed by electrical machinery (+7.9%) and transport (+0.6%). Digital Access Service for Priority Documents (DAS)

Japan Patent Office (JPO)

The JPO has notified the International Bureau (IB) that, with effect from 1 April 2025, it will extend the scope of its participation in DAS to include operation as a depositing Office for PCT applications filed electronically, unless the applicant requests, at the time of filing, that the application should not be made available to the Service.

Industrial Property Office of the Slovak Republic

The Industrial Property Office of the Slovak Republic has notified the IB that, with effect from 1 July 2025, it will commence operation both as a depositing Office and as an accessing Office of DAS. As a depositing Office, it will deposit certified copies of patent applications as priority documents on and after 1 July 2025, which the applicant specifically requests be made available to the service; as an accessing Office it will recognize priority documents available to it through the service for the purposes of any application for which the time limit for furnishing the priority document has not expired by 1 July 2025.

It is recalled that, by using DAS, a PCT applicant can request the IB to retrieve a copy of an earlier application from DAS for use as a priority document, instead of providing or arranging for the provision of a certified copy. The best practice for making such a request is by selecting the DAS option for providing the priority document to the IB in ePCT-Filing or, post-filing, using the dedicated "Action" in ePCT. Provided that the access code entered in ePCT matches the access code in DAS, the priority document is automatically made available to the internal processing system at the IB.

Please be aware that, in order to be able to make use of the DAS service, the Office with which the earlier application was filed must be a DAS depositing Office, and not necessarily the receiving Office with which the international application is filed. Information on DAS participating

PCT-Patent Prosecution Highway (PCT-PPH) Pilots

New one-way PCT-PPH pilot program (Directorate of Foreign Trade & Industrial Property, National Patent Office (Bahrain) – European Patent Office (EPO))

On 1 March 2025, a new one-way PCT-PPH pilot program started between the Directorate of Foreign Trade & Industrial Property, National Patent Office (Bahrain) and the EPO. Under this program, accelerated processing in the national phase before the Directorate of Foreign Trade & Industrial Property, National Patent Office (Bahrain) is available on the basis of a PCT application with a positive written opinion issued by the EPO in its capacity as an International Searching Authority (ISA) or an International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA), or a positive international preliminary report on patentability (IPRP) (Chapter II) (that is, where at least one of the claims has been determined as patentable). The agreement between the Directorate of Foreign Trade & Industrial Property, National Patent Office (Bahrain) and the EPO establishing the PCT-PPH pilot program also includes a two-way PPH program where accelerated processing is possible at one Office on the basis of claims that are determined to be patentable by the other Office.

IB International Bureau (corrigendum to fee tables)

The amount of the transmittal fee, payable to the International Bureau (IB) as receiving Office in USD, was erroneously indicated in Table I(a) of the PCT Fee Tables which were published in PCT Newsletter Nos. 01 and 02/2025. The correct amount of the fee is USD 117.

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This fee is due on the last day of the month containing the second anniversary (24 months) of the international filing date; where PCT Article 22 or 39(1) applies, it is payable within two months after performing the acts for entering the national phase, unless the 24-month time limit has not yet expired.

Practical Advice

Corrigendum to the Practical Advice in the February 2025 issue of the PCT Newsletter (No. 02/2025)

A portion of the following sentence published in the Practical Advice on page 7 of the above-mentioned issue was included in error, and has been removed (here shown as stuck through):

"However, it should be noted that in the case of a correction of a priority claim, if the International Bureau or receiving Office receives the notice of correction after the time limit but before it declares that the priority claim is considered void via FORM PCT/IB/111 (and not later than one month after the expiration of the..."

As the Practical Advice is a valuable resource for PCT users and continues to be searched and referenced, it is important that the information provided is as accurate as possible. We have therefore revised the original publication to reflect this correction.

Acting as an authorized signatory for a corporate applicant

Q: Our company is headquartered in Spain and has a subsidiary in Mexico. We are planning to file an international application in the name of our subsidiary with the receiving Office of Mexico (RO/MX), which would give us a wider choice of International Searching Authorities (ISAs), and we would like our in-house practitioner to manage and sign all submissions in the international phase. How should we designate this person in the PCT Request form (Form PCT/RO/101) and would it make any difference if we file with the International Bureau of WIPO as receiving Office (RO/IB)?

A: In cases where a qualified patent practitioner is part of a company's IP department, that person can be indicated as a patent agent by listing them as an agent in Box No. IV of the PCT Request form (agent, common representative, or address for correspondence), in accordance with PCT Rule 90.1. However, to act in this capacity, the in-house counsel must be entitled to practice before the receiving Office where the application is filed. If your in-house counsel managing the application is not entitled to practice before RO/MX, they cannot represent your company as an agent before RO/MX (PCT Rule 90.1) and should not be indicated as an agent in Box IV of the Request form.

As an alternative to having an appointed agent entitled to practice before RO/MX, any practitioner empowered by your company's internal procedures to represent it, may act as the company's authorized officer/signatory. Most receiving Offices, including RO/MX, do not require applicants to be represented by an agent during the international phase and an authorized officer/signatory can sign the application and any subsequent correspondence, including notices of withdrawal, on behalf of the company.

Authorized Officers/signatories do not need to have the right to practice before the RO concerned. However, it could be beneficial to have the application managed by someone familiar with the relevant procedures before the RO, ISA and designated Offices where the application may enter the national phase.

In this case, when completing the Request form of the PCT application, the authorized Officer/signatory should not be indicated as agent or common representative in Box No. IV (although they may be indicated as the address for correspondence but this would not authorise them to sign on behalf of the company), and equally, if using ePCT or any corresponding electronic filing system, the "agent" option should not be selected. Instead, the name of the

person signing should be clearly indicated next to their signature in Box No. X, making it clear that it is "signed on behalf of" the company, and providing the name of the company. When filing with RO/IB, ePCT has a drop-down box which allows you to state that the person signing on behalf of the corporate applicant has the capacity to do so. Unlike the appointment of an agent, no power of attorney is required, and under ordinary circumstances, no evidence is required as to the capacity to sign for the corporate applicant (Paragraph 127 of the Receiving Office Guidelines).

If you were to file the international application with RO/IB, the right to act as an agent before RO/IB is governed by PCT Rule 83.1*bis*, which ties the right to act as an agent for a particular PCT application to the nationality and residence of the applicant(s). This allows for a broader choice of agents when there are applicants of different nationalities and residences. For example, in your case, if the in-house counsel does not have the right to practice before RO/MX but has the right to practice before the receiving Office of Spain, they could then be indicated as an agent before RO/IB if the parent company headquartered in Spain is also an applicant.

Please note that if you indicate a person who is not entitled to practice before the RO as an "agent", the RO may change the indication *ex officio* to an "address for correspondence" (PCT Rule 4.4(d)). This person will then receive any correspondence for the applicant but will not be entitled to act on behalf of the applicant. Any application or subsequent correspondence drafted by the person acting as an address for correspondence will need to be signed by the applicant (or an authorized officer/signatory of any corporate applicant). PCT Fee Tables

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filling fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 5.189. A 90% reduction in the international filling fee (including the fee per sheet over 30), the supplementary search handling fee and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—refer to footnotes 2 and 14. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
