

### **Change to PCT Publication Schedule**

#### **Publication of 29 May 2025**

Due to the fact that Thursday, 29 May 2025 will be a non-working day at WIPO, PCT applications (as well as any *Official Notices (PCT Gazette)*) which would normally have been published on that day will be published on Friday, 30 May 2025. The date of completion of technical preparations for that publication will remain unchanged, and any changes that should be taken into account for the purposes of international publication should be received by the International Bureau by midnight (Central European Summer Time (CEST)) on Tuesday, 13 May 2025.

#### **ePCT Update**

A new version of the ePCT system was deployed on 19 March 2025 (version 4.15). This latest version brings numerous advantages to both applicants and Offices, including a new notification method, new 'Actions', and more automations of processes.

#### What's new in ePCT for applicants?

New notification method – ePCT

In addition to the existing "Email with PDF attachment" method of notification for correspondence purposes with applicants, "ePCT" has been introduced as a new method of communication for notifications from the International Bureau (IB) and, when applicable, from other PCT authorities. The new "ePCT" method provides a direct link to view and download relevant forms and documents in ePCT.

- Automation of the 'Action' for recording a change under PCT Rule 92bis

The online action for "Rule 92*bis* change request" is now almost fully automated. Form PCT/IB/306 is issued shortly after submitting the request, except in a few cases where manual examination is required. The process for completing and submitting this action remains unchanged, with the only difference being that Form PCT/IB/306 now includes the request submitted through the action as an attachment.

- New standalone 'Action' for declaration of inventorship

The Declaration of Inventorship (only for the purposes of the USA) is now available as a separate online action in the 'Actions' section of a filed International Application (IA). As a result, the Declaration of Inventorship is no longer included in the "Declarations under Rule 4.17" action, which now contains only the other four types of declarations.

- Improvements to other features also include:
  - DOCX format is now set as default for the specification when creating a new international application, when the selected receiving Office accepts this format. Another format can still be selected if preferred.
  - An Enhanced Document Download feature has been added for users experiencing difficulties downloading TIFF-based PDFs for large files in ePCT. Users can now download a ZIP file containing the PDF file and the TIFF images under "More".
  - Access to XML versions of ISR/WOSA documents in XML format has been extended to include unpublished applications. Links to these XML documents are available in the IA Header section (under the PCT application number), "Data" section (under "International Search") and "Documents" section (under "More").

#### • New Disclaimers:

- 1) "Rule 92bis Change Request" Action when a PCT Rule 92bis change request action is submitted after the completion of the technical preparations for international publication, a disclaimer appears in ePCT informing users that the changes will not be reflected in the international publication.
- 2) "Obtain Priority Document from DAS" Action when performing the "Obtain priority document from DAS" action on or after the publication date, a disclaimer now appears in ePCT, informing users that while the IB will retrieve the priority document from DAS, it will not be considered compliant with PCT Rule 17.1(b-bis).

#### What's new in ePCT for Offices?

In this version of ePCT, improvements have been implemented for the following features:

#### - RO:

- A new notification method (ePCT) allows applicants to choose to receive PCT
  Forms issued by IB/Offices as notifications containing links to the issued Forms
  accessible in ePCT;
- Improvement of the upload feature for downloading TIFF-based PDFs for large files in ePCT;
- Access to the XML versions of ISR/WOSA documents has been expanded to include unpublished IAs;

#### - ISA:

- Improvement of the upload IPC feature allows users to attach a CSV file to upload IPC codes;
- Improvement of the interface for adding specific categories (D, P, O, and &) for cited documents in the ISR;
- ISA users can now upload XML versions of the International Search Report,
   Written Opinion of the International Searching Authority and Article 17(2)(a) to the IB;
- Improvement of the 'Start international search' task so that it is now automatically closed if the ISR/WOSA is received by the IB. This covers reports generated in ePCT as well as reports uploaded through ePCT or transmitted to IB via EDI;

#### - IPEA:

- A new ePCT action is now available for IPEAs to create form PCT/IPEA/407 (currently available only in English and Chinese, and all other publication languages available in the future);
- A new ePCT action is now available for IPEAs to create form PCT/IPEA/440
   (currently available only in English and Chinese, and all other publication
   languages will be available in the future);

• Submission of IPEA Forms issued in ePCT will now be sent to the Chapter II agent (if present) instead of the Chapter I agent;

#### DO:

• Improvement of national phase entry (NPE) data – when multiple divisional applications are transmitted to the IB via ePCT, M2M, or EDI for a specific IA, they are now all retained in the database. Each event is displayed separately. To maintain consistency, the display of NPE data in ePCT has also been aligned with PATENTSCOPE display.

#### Issues relating to the deployment of version 4.15

While the new version of ePCT contains a number of valuable new features and improvements designed to streamline your PCT journey, a few technical issues occurred during the initial days after its deployment. These issues have since been resolved, and we sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused.

Applicants who may have experienced delays in meeting time limits - particularly those who may have missed the priority period, as a result of these technical problems - are invited to contact the International Bureau to explore any possible relief measures available. #### **European Patent Office - Updated PCT-EPO Guidelines**

The European Patent Office (EPO) has announced that the Guidelines for Search and Examination at the EPO as PCT Authority (PCT-EPO Guidelines) have been amended with effect from 1 April 2025. These Guidelines relate to the practice and procedure to be followed in the various aspects of the handling of international applications before the EPO as ISA and IPEA.

The major changes to the PCT-EPO Guidelines relate to the MyEPO Portfolio service, electronic notification and the decommissioning of fax and web-form filing. In addition, there is clarification of time-limit calculations and electronic fee-payment methods. Also, relevant content from the Euro-PCT Guide has been incorporated into the PCT-EPO Guidelines.

#### Validation of European Patents in the Lao People's Democratic Republic

A new agreement between the European Patent Organisation and the Government of the Lao People's Democratic Republic on the validation of European patents entered into force on 1 April 2025. As from that date, it is possible to validate European patents and European patent applications (including PCT applications containing a designation for a European patent) in the Lao People's Democratic Republic. European patents and applications validated in the Lao People's Democratic Republic will confer the same rights and legal effects as national applications and patents in the Lao People's Democratic Republic.

#### **Exceptional Non-working Days**

#### **Korean Intellectual Property Office**

The Korean Intellectual Property Office has notified the International Bureau (IB) that it will not be open to the public for the purposes of the transaction of official business on 3 June 2025 due to the designation of that day as a temporary national holiday.

It is recalled that, pursuant to PCT Rule 80.5, if the expiration of any period during which any document or fee in connection with an international application is required to reach an Office falls on a day on which the Office is not open to the public for the purposes of the transaction of official business, that period is extended so as to expire on the next subsequent business day.

#### **PCT Information Update**

#### **EP European Patent Organisation (location; fees)**

The location of the Berlin Office of the European Patent Office (EPO) has changed to the following:

Additionally, the EPO has notified the International Bureau that, with effect from 1 April 2025, the fee for validating a European patent in the Lao People's Democratic Republic, payable to it as designated (or elected) Office for international applications filed on or after that date, is EUR 180.

#### SE Sweden (fees; corrigendum)

As from 1 June 2025, there will be a change in the equivalent amounts of the international filing fee and the fee per sheet over 30, payable in SEK to the Swedish Intellectual Property Office (PRV) as receiving Office, as well as a change in the equivalent amount in SEK of the fee reduction listed under item 4(c) of the Schedule of Fees, as indicated in Fee Table I(a).

Additionally, reference is made to the change in the amount of the third year annual fee for patent applications and patents, payable to the Swedish Intellectual Property Office (PRV) as designated (or elected) Office, which was announced in *PCT Newsletter* No. 03/2025, on page 6. Please note that the correct amount of the fee, applicable since 15 March 2025, is SEK 1.600.

#### Handling fee (Swedish Intellectual Property Office (PRV))

As from 1 June 2025, there will be a change in the equivalent amount of the handling fee, payable in SEK to the Swedish Intellectual Property Office (PRV) as International Preliminary Examining Authority (IPEA). The new amount will be SEK 2,280.

## PCT SME Support Series (No. 1): How to begin the process of seeking patent protection for your invention internationally using the PCT

Q: I am an engineer working in a hi-tech start-up and have developed an idea for a new product. After refining the concept and building a prototype, I believe my invention has technical and commercial advantages over existing products. I've heard about the PCT and the possibility of using it to apply for patent protection throughout the world. How do I go about this? Where do I start and what are the steps to take? How can I find out about the costs, time limits, and options available to me if I choose this path so that I can develop a long-term strategy?

A: The Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) is an efficient and flexible tool for seeking international patent protection. With a single application filed in one place and in one language, you can have up to 30 months to evaluate your chances of and options for seeking patent protection in nearly all countries globally. Watch this <u>3 minute video</u> and refer to the <u>list of PCT Contracting States</u> to discover the advantages of using the PCT.

In addition to the time you have, the PCT provides valuable information, in the form of an international search report and a written opinion, to evaluate your invention's potential patentability. Once WIPO has published your PCT application, usually after 18 months, this information can help attract investment in your invention.

#### Getting started on intellectual property (IP)

Before filing a patent application, you should assess the necessity of IP protection. The <u>WIPO IP Diagnostics tool</u> can help you evaluate your invention's patentability and potential commercial value. It is also useful to conduct a basic state-of-the-art search in a patent database (for example, <u>PATENTSCOPE</u>) to determine if your invention is new.

Developing a long-term vision and strategic plan for IP protection is also crucial. WIPO's Guide to IP for Startups ("Enterprising Ideas") provides valuable insights and guidance on this matter. Local Technology and Innovation Support Centers (TISCs) can assist you with this before incurring further costs on filing. Before you file the first application for your invention, it is essential that you keep your invention secret using confidentiality agreements where necessary.

#### Preparing to file a national patent application

For cost and strategic reasons, the vast majority of users first file a national or regional patent application before filing a PCT application. To do this, it is best to get advice from a local patent professional (attorney/agent). While many national Offices can provide you with information and assistance, using a patent professional is recommended to avoid potential difficulties or costs associated with amending or correcting an application after filing. Please consult our web page for the <u>list of national and regional IP offices</u> and their contact details. The local Office may be able to provide you with a list of registered IP professionals in their country and recommend programs that could assist you (for example, the <u>WIPO Inventors Assistance Program</u>) and any other pro bono support available at a national or international level. National government and business associations might also provide further assistance or funding for patent protection.

#### Evaluating your readiness for the PCT

It is important to ensure your invention and technical documents are at an advanced stage – having to file a new PCT application due to changes in your invention can be expensive. Later


corrections and amendments may only be possible in certain circumstances and may require professional assistance.

#### The PCT Application Process

Once your first national or regional application is filed, you have up to 12 months to file a PCT application, using the filing date of your earliest national or regional application as the date from which you can claim priority (maintaining your rights as if the PCT application had been filed on the same date as your national/regional filing). After this time, it is not possible to file a further PCT application with the same priority and you cannot add new matter to a previously-filed PCT application.

The PCT application process consists of two main phases:

- The international phase:
  - You can submit your application to the International Bureau (IB) of WIPO or a national or regional patent Office. An International Searching Authority (ISA) will conduct a search on the state of the art, also known as the prior art. This will give you important information on the probability of patentability and an indication of the potential scope of patent protection of your invention. 18 months after the priority date, WIPO will publish the patent application and the search report.
- The national phase:
  - Generally, within 30 months from the priority date, you will need to initiate the national phase in the specific countries where you want patent protection. You will need to submit translations and engage local representatives where necessary. The responsible patent Office will examine your application and grant the patent if appropriate. The information from the international phase is non-binding on national Offices but may be the best information on patentability available.



#### Advantages of a PCT Application

A single application and central management of formalities:
 You only need to submit application documents once and in a single language, saving costs and effort for up to 30 months.

#### - Scope of coverage:

Your PCT application is recognized by all 158 Contracting States of the PCT, thereby keeping a maximum number of options open to you.

#### – Flexibility:

You have 30 months to decide in which countries you want to seek patent protection and when to enter the national phase. This can be accelerated in some countries via the Patent Prosecution Highway (PPH).

#### Fee reductions:

While application filing and search fees in the PCT can be significant, fee reductions are available for individual inventors and applicants from developing and least developed countries. More information on fees relating to PCT applications can be found here:

#### Recommended Next Steps:

- Consult a patent attorney: a patent attorney can provide guidance on the patent application process and help you navigate the complexities of the PCT.
- Prepare your application: gather all the necessary documents, including technical drawings and a detailed description of your invention.
- Submit your application: following the advice of your patent professional, submit your application to your national patent office or PCT receiving Office.
- If you file nationally first: monitor the 12-month priority period from your first application so that you don't miss the time limit to file a PCT application and preserve your priority date.

#### **Practical Advice**

#### Correcting elements or parts of an international application on or after the filing date

Q: I submitted a PCT application and, after reviewing the submission, realized that I had submitted the wrong set of drawings. Do I need to withdraw and re-file the application? And what could I do if I only noticed such a mistake the day after filing?

A: Given that no fees have been paid yet, you may consider submitting a new PCT application provided that there is still time left in the day, while the already filed PCT application can be withdrawn at a later stage.

Alternatively, and provided there is still time left in the day, you may consider the possibility of completing or correcting your application (including replacing erroneously filed pages) in

accordance with PCT Rule 20.5bis(b) or (c). As you noticed the mistake on the same day the application was filed, if you filed the PCT application using ePCT, there is a specific functionality for such corrections. The "same day correction" functionality enables you to add documents that were omitted or to replace already submitted documents up until midnight in the time zone of the receiving Office and still be accorded the same day as the international filing date. Once that deadline has passed, the same day correction functionality will no longer be available.

It is important to note that a few receiving Offices do not provide this technical facility1.

If you only noticed the mistake after the international filing date, you would have the following options:

Correcting erroneously filed elements or parts with incorporation by reference

If the correct drawings are included in the priority application, you could attempt to incorporate them by reference provided you meet the conditions under PCT Rules 20.5bis(d) and 20.6. In such a case, the original international filing date will be maintained, but you can only add the correct drawings and not remove the mistakenly filed ones, with the result that you will have two sets of drawings in the PCT application. Incorporation by reference could be useful if you are outside the priority period as correcting the international filing date to the date of receipt of a correct element under PCT Rule 20.5bis(c) could result in loss of priority. Moreover, a few designated Offices have notified the International Bureau of the incompatibility of these provisions with their national law under PCT Rule 20.8(b-bis). Any elements or parts incorporated by reference will not be considered as being part of the PCT application in the national phase before these designated Offices (a list of these Offices can be found on WIPO's website at:

https://www.wipo.int/pct/en/texts/reservations/res incomp.html.)

Furthermore, a few receiving Offices have outstanding notifications of incompatibility under PCT Rule 20.8(a-bis) and do not process requests for incorporation by reference. However, for these receiving Offices, the applicant may request the receiving Office to transmit the international application to the receiving Office of the International Bureau under PCT Rule 19.4(a)(iii), which does process requests for incorporation by reference.

Correcting erroneously filed elements or parts without incorporation by reference

If the correct drawings are not contained in the priority application, or if your international application did not claim any priority at all, or if you would accept a later international filing date, for example because you are still within the priority period, the procedure for correcting

Please note that the same day correction function in ePCT is not available for the receiving Offices of Canada, Israel and the United States of America; although it is possible to prepare a .zip file using ePCT-Filing for upload to the e-filing system of those Offices, it is not possible to use ePCT to submit applications online to them.

international applications containing erroneously filed pages under PCT Rule 20.5bis(c), available to all applicants with all receiving Offices, might be the better option as it would allow you to add the correct drawings and remove the erroneously filed drawings. Although in this case the international filing date will be changed to the date on which the receiving Office receives all the correct elements or parts, this saves applicants from withdrawing the application and filing it again. The time limit for doing this, under PCT Rule 20.7, is two months from the date on which the application was first filed at the receiving Office or, if it is the receiving Office that notices the mistake and invites the applicant to correct it, two months from the invitation by the receiving Office.

If the time limit has expired, you would have to file a new PCT application to correct the mistake completely. Whether you should withdraw the PCT application previously filed would depend on whether fees had been paid for that application and if yes, whether you are still able to get some refund of the fees paid. That said, if you noticed the mistake outside the priority period, but still within two months after the expiration of the priority period, you could still file a new application again and request restoration of the right of priority. However, the chances of obtaining a positive finding to have the priority right restored would, under these circumstances, be slim². You are therefore advised to think twice before deciding to file a new application to correct the mistake.

The following Tables show the amounts and currencies of the main PCT fees which are payable to the receiving Offices (ROs) and the International Preliminary Examining Authorities (IPEAs) during the international phase under Chapter I (Tables I(a) and I(b)) and under Chapter II (Table II). Fees which are payable only in particular circumstances are not shown; nor are details of certain reductions and refunds which may be available; such information can be found in the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, Annexes C, D and E. Note that all amounts are subject to change due to variations in the fees themselves or fluctuations in exchange rates. The international filling fee may be reduced by CHF 100, 200 or 300 where the international application, or part of the international application, is filed in electronic form, as prescribed under Item 4(a), (b) and (c) of the Schedule of Fees (annexed to the Regulations under the PCT) and the *PCT Applicant's Guide*, paragraph 5.189. A 90% reduction in the international filling fee (including the fee per sheet over 30), the supplementary search handling fee and the handling fee, as well as an exemption from the transmittal fee payable to the International Bureau as receiving Office, is also available to applicants from certain States—refer to footnotes 2 and 14. (Note that if the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction, as the case may be, and the 90% reduction are applicable, the 90% reduction is calculated *after* the CHF 100, 200 or 300 reduction.) The footnotes to the Fee Tables follow Table II.
