### MADRID PROTOCOL CONCERNING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION OF MARKS

#### Individual Fees under Article 8(7): Finland

1. In accordance with Rule 35(2)(c) of the Common Regulations under the Madrid Agreement and Protocol, the Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) has, at the request of the Office of Finland, established the following new amounts in Swiss francs of the individual fee that is payable when Finland is designated in an international application, in a designation subsequent to international registration or in respect of the renewal of an international registration:

2. This change will take effect on April 1, 2008. Therefore, these amounts will be payable where Finland

(a) is designated in an international application which is received, or is deemed to have been received under Rule 11(1)(c), by the Office of origin on or after that date, or

(b) is the subject of a subsequent designation which is received by the Office of the Contracting Party of the holder on or after that date, or is filed direct with the International Bureau on or after that date, or

(c) has been designated in an international registration which is renewed on or after that date.
