Patent claims

- Define the scope of protection
- Provide an advantage or solve a problem
- Avoid the prior art
- Clear, concise and self-contained



Independent claims

Broadest definitions of invention

Essential features only

1. A method of brewing tea, comprising steeping teal leaves in water.









Dependent claims

Advantageous implementations

Fall-back positions

Not limiting on the scope of independent claims

Progressively focus on "embodiments"

- 1. A method of brewing tea, comprising steeping tea leaves in water.
- 2. The method according to claim 1, wherein the tea leaves are provided in a tea bag.
- 3. The method according to claim 2, wherein the bag is of pyramidal shape.











1. A multi-function tool, comprising:

a narrow handle;

a wide spoon;

a wide fork; and

a serrated knife.



2. The multi-function tool of claim 1, further comprising: the handle is 5 cm long; the spoon is 3 cm long; and the fork is 3 cm long.



1. A multi-function tool, consisting of:

a handle;

a spoon provided at the first end of the handle; and a fork provided at the second end of the handle.



1. A multi-function tool, comprising:

a handle having a first end and a second end;

a spoon provided at the first end;

a fork provided at the second end; and

a knife on one of the outermost prongs of the fork.



- 2. The multi-function feeding tool of claim 1, wherein the fork contains a knife.
- 3. The multi-function feeding tool of claim 2, wherein instead of a spoon, a shovel is at the first end.



1. A chair consisting of:

a seat;

four legs mounted to and extending from the seat and configured to support the seat in an elevated position; and

a backrest connected to the seat and extending from the seat in a direction opposite to a direction in which the legs extend.



1. A chair, comprising:

a seat;

at least one leg mounted to and extending below the seat;

a backrest mounted to and extending above the seat; and

a pair of arms mounted to the seat and the backrest and extending out from the backrest between the top of the backrest and the seat.



1. A chair, comprising:

a seat;

at least one leg mounted to and extending below the seat;

a backrest mounted to and extending above the seat; and

a pair of arms mounted to the seat and the backrest and positioned to support the arms of the human user.




1. A foot rest, comprising:

first and second plates;

the hinge connecting the first plate to the second plate; and

a stabilizing support mounted to at least one of

the plates.



- The foot rest of claim 1, further comprising an antiskid buffer attached to the bottom of the first plate.
- The foot rest of claim 1, wherein the anti-skid buffer comprises a composition with a coefficient of friction higher than a coefficient of friction of the first plate.
