## Introduction

- Why The Harare Protocol was Amended:
  - In order to improve and harmonize the Harare
     Protocol with the international treaties like the Paris
     Convention, Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual
     Property (TRIPS) and the Patent Cooperation Treaty
     (PCT);
  - To make the protocol more attractive to users and the public at large;
  - Most of the Proposals came from users like you;
  - The Amendments are highlighted in the Annex I



## Introduction (cont.)

- Why the Banjul Protocol was amended:
  - The Banjul Protocol has not been performing as expected
    - It has not been attractive to both users and Member States.
  - The number of trademark applications received per year has been very low and only 9 out of the 19 Member States are party to the Protocol.
  - The amendments also have been necessitated by the developments in the international trademark practice and are based on proposals from users and Member States;
  - The biggest amendment is the Introduction of "Individual fees based on the Madrid System of WIPO;



## Introduction (cont.)

- With effect from January 1, 2015, applications, designation and renewal fees for Tanzania will be based on their local fees;
- Botswana has elected to use the current share of fees of 50%.
- Other countries have not yet indicated their preferred fees;
- Amendments to the Banjul Protocol are indicated in Annex II;
- Declaration of Individual Fees Form: Annex III
