



INTERNATIONAL TRADEMARK APPICATIONS ORIGINATING FROM VIETNAM




INTERNATIONAL TRADEMARK APPLICATIONS DESINATING VIETNAM

Legislation:

- IP Law (Jul 2006)
- Degrees (2006), Circulars (2007)
- Trademark Regulation (2010)
- Patent Examination Guideline (2010)

Office capacity:

- Trademark Divisions (No 1, 2): 50 examiners
- International Trademark Section (Sep. 2010): 07 examiners
- Design Division: 10 examiners
- Patent Divisions (No. 1, 2, 3): 50 examiners
- Computerized administration system



Current Status: Madrid Applications

- The number of international applications for registration of marks extended to Vietnam and that from Vietnam extended to contracting countries under the Madrid Agreement has been increasing year by year
- 12-month time limit for notifying a provisional refusal
- Limitation on number and qualification of the examiners
- Examiner must cover all classes, cannot deepen knowledge and experiences in any specialized section
- Search tool for examiners not powerful enough

Consequences:

- Big burden on examiners
- Hard to improve the quality




Current Status: PCT Applications

- PCT applications designating/selecting Vietnam must enter the National Stage within 31 months from the priority date
- The time of processing PCT applications in the National Stage shall begin on the first day of the 32th month from the priority date
- Earlier processing is allowed on request
- Grade period of 6 months
- After entered the National Stage, PCT applications shall be examined in accordance with the procedures stipulated for normal applications



Current Status: PCT Applications





Current Status: PCT Applications

- 18-month time limit for search and substantive examination
- Using the search and examination results of the corresponding applications is allowable (granted patents, ISR, IPER ext.)
- PCT applications:
 - Easy to make the first communication
 - Likely to be pending

Consequences:

- Backlog
- Hard to improve the quality



Future Perspectives

- International applications tend to be increased
- Office capacity is still limited
- Backlog is serious problem

Actions should be taken:

- Completion of the Legal Documents
- Improvement of Office capacity: examiners, administration, search system and database ext.
- International cooperation: training examiners, technical assistance
