
# **Initial Implementation**

#### Lead up work

- Internal consultation and change management
- External stakeholder consultation
- Support from the IB and valuable insights from other IP Offices

### 'Big Bang' release – 1 July 2022


- National Phase Entry, direct filings, new PCT applications
- Online filing system updated accept only XML sequence listings
- Downstream system changes case management systems and publication processes
- Using WIPO Sequence Validator to perform validation



# **Initial Implementation**


#### Initial challenges – internal and external

- Manual processing
  - Two different case management systems
  - Different processes for national and PCT applications
- No stylesheets in use
- Customer education and awareness
  - Dedicated page on IP Australia's website Requirements, FAQ section, links to WIPO resources
- Procedural errors and customer 'workarounds'
- Some specific technical issues, e.g.
  - Receiving and process large sequences
  - Skipped sequences when converting from ST.25 to ST.26



### Improvements

- Regular deployment of validator tool updates
- Development of stylesheets lacksquare
  - XML sequence
  - Validation report  $\bullet$
- Direct filings lacksquare
  - Automated validation and conversion for applications received via IP Australia's online filing system
- National Phase Entry  $\bullet$ 
  - 'Just in time' NPE processing using WIPO's ePCT ulletwebservice
  - Automated validation and conversion for National ulletPhase Entry sequences
- PCT applications
  - Single case management system  $\bullet$
  - Future improvement: Automated validation and  $\bullet$ conversion for PCT applications in Continuous Improvement backlog





### First year in numbers


### Filings 1 July 2022-30 June 2023

- 236 International (PCT) filings
- 649 direct applications
- 16 national phase entry applications
- Ratio expected to shift around 75% or Australia's domestic applications are National Phase Entries
  - E.g. in 2022: 32,264 domestic applications, of which 23,685 were NPE

#### **Correction rates**

- ST.26: 2.6% requiring a correction or resubmission
- Last year of ST.25: 10.7% requiring a correction or resubmission




### **Other standards**

#### ST.27 Legal Status API

- Presented at CWS/10:

- API publicly exposed
  - See IP Australia's API Developer Portal for more information and instructions: <u>https://portal.api.ipaustralia.gov.au/s/</u>
  - Response in XML (ST.96) or JSON format
- Refactoring components internally
  - Part of ongoing continuous improvement and IP Australia's cloud transformation journey
  - Users will not be affected
  - PoC, to be applied to other applications if successful
- Possible future improvement: Legal Status bulk data product

- Updated and published monthly

- Certain issues identified following CWS/10
  - Primarily affecting older records
  - Duplicated publications with kind codes that should not co-exist
  - Missing publication dates
- In progress: Updating generation rules and script to address identified issues
- To do: updates required to support PCT Minimum Documentation requirements from 1 January 2026
