

**Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO: Sixty-Eighth Series of Meetings
July 7 to 15, 2026**

General Statement of Denmark

Denmark aligns itself with the statements made by the European Union and Group B.

Firstly, Denmark would like to warmly congratulate Mr Daren Tang on his reappointment as Director General of WIPO. Denmark welcomes the continued confidence shown by Member States in his leadership and looks forward to working closely with him during his second term. We value his efforts to strengthen WIPO as a forward-looking organisation that effectively serves users and ensures that intellectual property continues to act as a driver of innovation, growth and development.

In this regard, we also reiterate that the objective of WIPO is to promote the protection of intellectual property throughout the world through cooperation among states, and to ensure administrative cooperation among the unions.

The efficient functioning of WIPO's global services, particularly the PCT, Madrid and Hague systems, remains of utmost importance to Danish users. We commend WIPO's ongoing efforts to modernise and improve these systems, including through digitalisation and IT development, and stress the continued need for simplification, cost-efficiency and user-friendliness.

Denmark further welcomes WIPO's work at the intersection of intellectual property and emerging technologies, including artificial intelligence. As technological developments continue to accelerate, it is essential that WIPO provides a platform for inclusive dialogue and supports the development of balanced and future-proof intellectual property frameworks.

In line with other like-minded countries, Denmark reaffirms its strong and unwavering support for Ukraine. We stand firmly behind Ukraine's sovereignty, independence and territorial integrity within its internationally recognised borders.

Denmark strongly condemns Russia's ongoing war of aggression against Ukraine and calls on Russia to immediately cease its violations of international law and withdraw its troops from the entire territory of Ukraine.

Denmark remains committed to ensuring full accountability for Russia's actions and notes the continued severe impact of the war on Ukraine's innovation and intellectual property ecosystem, as reflected in WIPO reporting.

Denmark welcomes the decision adopted during the 65th series of meetings of the Assemblies of the Member States of WIPO (document A/65/7) under agenda item 18, entitled "*Assistance and Support for Ukraine's Innovation and Creativity Sector and Intellectual Property System*". Denmark attaches great importance to the full implementation of this decision.

Denmark reaffirms its continued support for WIPO's assistance and support for Ukraine's innovation and creativity sectors and intellectual property system.

With regard to the timing of the Assemblies, several European WIPO Member States traditionally observe their summer holidays in July, during which schools and offices are closed. We therefore encourage the Secretariat to reconsider the timing of the Assemblies.

Finally, Denmark reiterates its commitment to actively engage in and support WIPO's work. We will continue to contribute in a constructive, pragmatic and solution-oriented manner to the Organisation and its bodies.
