MATTERSCONCERNINGT HEWIPOCOPY RIGHTTREATY

*Memorandum*preparedbytheSecretariat

- 1. The present document contains information and proposal son procedural questions and the future work relative to the inaugurals ession of the WIPO Copyright Treaty Assembly (herein the "WC Assembly"). It is proposed that the WCT Assembly adopt rules of procedure, elect of ficers, and consider its future work during this session.
- 2. ItisnotedthattheWIPOCopyrightTreaty(WCT)cameintoforceonMarch6,2002, andthattheWIP OPerformancesandPhonogramsTreaty(WPPT)cameintoforceon May 20,2002,basedoneachhavingreceivedtheminimumnumberof30ratificationsor accessions.TheWCTandtheWPPTeachcontainseveralsimilarprovisions,andbothdeal withmanyidentica lquestionsandissues.ReferenceisthereforemadetoRule42ofthe WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure ("WhentwoormorebodiesoftheOrganizationorofthe Unionsmustexaminequestionsofcommoninteresttothem,theyshallholdjointmeetings.") Withtheforegoinginmind,itissuggestedthattheWCTAssemblyandtheWPPTAssembly conducttheirinauguralsessionsinjointsession.

ADOPTIONOFRULESOFPROCEDURE

GeneralRulesofProcedure

3. WCTArticle15(5)states:

"Assembly

. .

- "(5) The Assembly shallest ablishits own rules of procedure, including the convocation of extraordinary sessions, the requirements of a quorum and, subject to the provisions of this Treaty, the required majority for various kinds of decisions."
- 4. Itisproposedthat,inordertofulfilltheaboveWCTobligation,theWCTAssembly adoptasitsownRulesofProcedurethe *WIPOGeneral RulesofProcedure* (WIPO publicationnumber399(FE)Rev.3),ashaseveryotherbodywithinWIPO,withthefurther understandingthatcertainSpecialRulestothose *WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure*, as hereinafterfullyspecified,alsobecontemporaneouslyadopted.

SpecialRules

- 5. BeingamongthemostrecentexpressionsofthewilloftheMemberStatesofWIPO withrespecttointernationallegalinstruments,theWCTcontainscertainprovisionswhich somewhatbreakawayfrompracticesinotherpriorWIPOtreatiesandconventions.Asa consequence,itisnecessarytoconsidercertainSpecialRulestothe WIPOGen eralRulesof Procedure.
- 6. Amendmentofthe WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure isexpresslyauthorized.
 - (a) Officers
- 7. Rule9ofthe WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure states thatofficersshallbeelectedin thefirstmeetingofeachordinarysession.
- 8. Thegeneral rule for officers of WIPO bodies is that they serve from their election at an ordinary session, up to but not including the next ordinary session, generally aperiod of two

years. The present meeting of the WC TAssembly presents a question as to whether it is meeting in ordinary or extraordinary session, and as to the term of the officers to be elected, in that the WIPO General Assembly is meeting in extraordinary session in 2002. It is the current practice that, as a rule, all bodies when meeting to gether with the WIPO General Assembly do so in either a common extraordinary or or dinary session (in even and oddy ears, respectively). Thus, they are in 2002 also meeting in extraordinary sessions (except for the Coordination Committee). It is also to be noted that the Madrid Assembly, the PCTAssembly, the IPC Assembly, the Locarno Assembly and the Budapest Assembly metinex traordinary sessions for their in augural meetings.

9. Withtheforegoinginmi nd,itisproposedthattheWCTAssemblymeetsin extraordinarysessionin2002andinordinarysessionin2003. Itisalsoproposedthatthe ChairmanandVice -ChairmenoftheWCTAssemblybeelectedforaperiodofoneyear, i.e., fortheperiodoftheo neyearfromthisinauguralsession(2002)uptobutnotincludingthe sessionnextyear(2003), which will be an ordinary session in line with all other WIPO bodies which then will be meeting. By designating the first session of the WCTAssembly as extraordinary, and by establishing an initial termfortheofficers presently being elected at one year, the WCTAssembly, and its initial of ficers, will thus be placed in a lignment with the other bodies within WIPO.

(b) Delegations

- 10. The *WIPOGe neralRulesofProcedure* specifythatdelegationsarecomprisedofonly MemberStates. ⁴The *WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure* alsospecifythatintergovernmental organizationsshallbeobservers. ⁵
- 11. Notwithstandingtheforegoing, the WCT defines the status of certain intergovernmental organizations within the context of the WCTAs sembly. That status differs from the observer status which the WIPO General Rules of Procedure give to intergovernmental organizations. In that regard, WCTA rticle 17 states:

"EligibilityforBecomingPartytotheTreaty

"(1) AnyMemberStateofWIPOmaybecomepartytothisTreaty.

- "(2) The Assembly may decide to admit any intergovernmental organization to be come party to this Treaty which declares that it is competent in respect of, and has its own legislation binding on all its Member States on, matters covered by this Treaty and that it has been duly authorized, in accordance with its internal procedures, to be come party to this Treaty.
- "(3) The European Community, having made the declaration referred to in the preceding paragraph in the Diplomatic Conference that has adopted this Treaty, may be come party to this Treaty."
- 12. Rule7ofthe *WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure* shouldthereforebereplacedb ya SpecialRule,suchthatthedefinitionof 'Delegations' isexpandedtoincludethose intergovernmentalorganizationswhichbecomeContractingPartiesinaccordance with Article 17(2)or(3)oftheWCT.
- 13. Itisproposedtoreplacethecurren tRule7ofthe *WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure* withthefollowingSpecialRule:

Rule7:Delegations

- (1) Each Statemember of abody shall be represented by one or more delegates, who may be assisted by alternates, advisors, and experts.
- $(2) Any interg\ overnmental organization which becomes a party to the WCT in accordance with Article 17(2) or (3) of that Treaty shall be deemed a delegation, and shall accrue the same benefits as a State delegation, in accordance with the provisions of the serules.$
 - (3) Eachdelegationshallhaveaheadofdelegation.
- (4) Anyalternate, advisoror expert may act as de legate by orders of the head of his de legation.
- (5) Eachdelegateoralternateshallbeaccreditedbythecompetentauthorityof the Stateorintergovernmenta lorganization which herepresents. The Director General shall be notified of the appointment of delegates and alternates in a letter, note or telegram, is suing preferably from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, or the competent authority of the intergovern mentalorganization.
- (c) Voting
- 14. The WIPOGeneralRulesofProcedure specifythatonlydelegationsmayvote:

"Rule25:Voting

"Proposalsandamendmentssubmittedbyadelegationshallbeputtothevote onlyiftheyaresupportedbyatle astoneotherdelegation.

"Rule39:Observers

"Observers shall not have the right to vote."

15. However, WCTArticle 15(3)(b) states:

"Assembly

...

- "(b)AnyContractingPartythatisanintergovernmentalorganizationmay participateinthev ote,inplaceofitsMemberStates,withanumberofvotesequalto thenumberofitsMemberStateswhicharepartytothisTreaty.Nosuch intergovernmentalorganizationshallparticipateinthevoteifanyoneofitsMember Statesexercisesitsrightto voteandviceversa."
- 16. InviewoftheWCTprovisionsallowingcertainintergovernmentalorganizationsto become parties, to be delegations, and to vote in the WCTAssembly, it is proposed to replace Rule 25 of the WIPOGeneral Rules of Proced ure, with the following Special Rule:

Rule25:Voting

- $(1) \ \ Proposals and amendments submitted by a delegation shall be put to the vote only if they are supported by at least one other delegation.$
- (2) AnyContractingPartythatisanintergovernmentalor ganizationmay participateinthevote,inplaceofitsMemberStates,withanumberofvotesequalto thenumberofitsMemberStateswhicharepartytothisTreaty.Nosuch intergovernmentalorganizationshallparticipateinthevoteifanyoneofitsM ember Statesexercisesitsrighttovoteandviceversa.
 - 17. The WCTAssembly is invited to consider and:
 - (i) approvetheproposalcontainedin paragraph 9,above;
 - (ii) adoptasitsownRulesof ProceduretheWIPOGeneralRulesof Procedureref erredtoinparagraph 4,above; (iii) adopttheSpecialRulescontained inparagraphs 13and16,above.

FUTUREWORK

- 18. ThefutureworkoftheWCTAssemblycanbedividedintotwomainareas:
- (i) promotingfurtherratifications and accession stothe Treaty; and (ii) working towards effective implementation of the Treaty. ⁶Towards that end, the Secretaria twill organize meetings in some States on adherence to and implementation of the Treaty. In addition, the Secretaria twill also render, as appropriate, legal advice, especially in preparing national legislation, participate in relevant seminars and meetings, and produce studies and other information publications in this area.
