- $1. \quad At the four thsession of the Working Group on Constitutional Reform ("the Working Group"), the Working Group examined document WO/GA/WG CR/4/3 ("Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property Draft Texts of Amendments to Administrative and Financial Provisions Agreed in Principle"). The document sets out draft texts for the implementation of proposals agreed in principle and draft texts of options for issues still under consideration in the context of the Paris Convention as at reaty that typifies the WIPO-administered treaties that establish contribution financed Union s. The Working Group was unable to complete its discussion of the draft text of modifications, as some delegations expressed the wish to have more time to study the draft texts (see document A/36/10, paragraph 15).$
- 2. AstheWorkingGroupdidn otreachagreementontheoutstandingitemsinthedraft text,thefollowingpagesofthisdocumentreproduce(asanannextothisdocument)thedraft provisionsinthesameformatandcontentasthoseoriginallydistributedanddiscussedatthe fourthses sionoftheWorkingGroup,ascontainedindocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/3.

- 1. ThesessionsoftheWorkingGrouponConstitutionalReform("theWorkingGroup") heldsofarhaveresultedin agreementinp rinciple torecommendanumberofproposed amendmentstotheconstitutionalstructureofWIPOandoftheUnionsadministeredby WIPO.
- $2. \quad By "agreement in principle," the Working Group has intended to signify tentative or provisional agreement to proceed with a particular proposal, subject, nevertheless, to are view of the proposal in the context of the complete set or package of proposal sthat may emerge from the discussions of the Working Group. In other words, no particular proposal is to be regarded as finally agreed until the discussions of all proposal shave been completed to the satisfaction of the Working Group.$

- 3. DocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/2setsoutdraftprovisionsfortheimplementation,inthe ConventionEstablishingtheWor ldIntellectualPropertyOrganization("theWIPO Convention),ofthevariousproposedreforms,aswellasoptionsforprovisionsinrespectof outstandingproposalsonwhichagreementinprinciplehasnotyetbeenreached.Thepresent documentprovidesdr afttextsfortheimplementationofproposalsagreedinprincipleand drafttextsofoptionsforissuesstillunderconsiderationinthecontextoftheParisConvention fortheProtectionofIndustrialProperty("theParisConvention").
- 4. Each oftheWIPOtreatiesunderwhichanAssemblyofcontractingpartiesis establishedcontainsstandard -formprovisionsontheestablishmentandfunctioningofthe Assembly. The provisions of the Paris Convention concerning the Assembly of the Paris Unionan dother administrative and financial clauses are, in all material respects, the same as corresponding provisions in other contribution financed WIPO treaties. The draft text provided in the following pages is meant to serve a sanillustration of almost id entical changes that would need to be made to the other WIPO treaties.
- 5. Inordertofacilitateeaseofreferenceandcomparison,theNotesconcerningeach ArticlereproducetheexistingprovisionoftheParisConventioninaclearlydistinguis hable box. Theproposedre -draftoftherelevantprovisionsorthemodifications introduced are represented in *bolditalics*, wherewordshave been changed or inserted, or by a vordshave been deleted without replacement.

NotesonArticle13

- 13.01 Article13containstheprovisionsdealingwiththeAssemblyoftheParisUnion.Two mainsetsofmodificationstotheprovisionsofArticle13areprese ntedfortheconsideration oftheWorkingGroup;first,bywayofalternative(AlternativeB),aprovisionispresented whichwouldimplementtheproposalunderconsiderationthattheWIPOGeneralAssembly bemadethecompetentassemblyforalltheWIPO -administeredtreaties;and,secondly,also bywayofalternative,certainprovisionshavebeenplaced insquarebrackets(see Article 13 (2)(a)(iv)and(v))whichwouldbedeletedintheeventthattheWorkingGroup decidedtoproposetheabolitionofthe ExecutiveCommitteeoftheParisUnion.
- 13.02 *Article13(1)* setsoutalternativesfortheconstitutionandoperationoftheAssemblyof contractingStates. *AlternativeA* maintainsthe *statusquo* ,namely,theconstitutionofthe AssemblyoftheParisUnio nasaseparateanddiscreetAssemblywhosemembersarethose StatesthatarepartytotheStockholm(1967)ActoftheParisConvention.

 Ofthe162StatespartytotheParisConvention,allbut3arepartytotheStockholm(1967) Act.ThethreeStateswhi charepartytotheParisConventionbutnottotheStockholm (1967)ActofthatConventionaretheDominicanRepublic,NigeriaandtheSyrianArab Republic.
- 13.03 *AlternativeB* of Article 13(1) is intended to implement the proposal under consideration that the WIPO General Assembly be the competent, unitary Assembly for all WIPO-administered treaties. It envisages simply the establishment of the WIPO General Assembly as the competent Assembly for the Paris Union. States which are party to the Stockholm (1967) Act (or lateramend ments to that Act) would be come members of the WIPO General Assembly "for the purposes of matters concerning this Convention." This provision is to be read in conjunction with the corresponding alternative proposed for Article 6(1)(a) of the WIPO Convention (see document WO/GA/WG -CR/4/2).

Article13oftheParisConvention AssemblyoftheUnion

13.05 IfitweredecidedtoadopttheproposalfortheWIPOGeneralAssemblytoactasa unitaryAssemblyforallWIPO -administeredtreaties,severaleconomiescouldbeachievedin thedraftingof *Article13(2)(a),(3)and(8)* toeliminateprovisionsthatalreadyexistinthe WIPOConventionandthatwouldnotneedtoberepeatedinthisArticleoftheParis Convention.IntothiscategoryfallArticle13(2)(a)(ix),13(a)and(8).Theseprovisionshave beenleftwithoutamendmentinthepresentdrafttextpending adecisiononthedesirabilityof theunitaryAssembly.

13.06 The exception to the maintenance of the status quo in Article 13(2)(a) relates to the provisions in Article 13(2)(a)(iv) and (v). Those provisions concern the Executive Committee of the Paris Union and are set out in square brackets. If the Working Group were to recommend the abolition of the Executive Committee (see Article 14, below), the provision sin square brackets would be deleted.

13.07 *Article13(2)(b)* concernstheroleoftheWIPOC oordinationCommittee.If AlternativeCofArticle8oftheWIPOConvention(seedocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/2) wereadopted(namely,theabolitionoftheCoordinationCommittee),Article13(2)(b)would needtobedeleted.

- 13.10 *Article13(6)* alsoremainsunchanged. Asmentioned above, there are three States party to the Paris Convention which, by virtue of not being party to the Stockholm (1967) Act, are not members of the Assembly of the Paris Union. Of those three States (Dominican Republic, Nigeriaand the Syrian Arab Republic), one (the Syrian Arab Republic) is not a member of WIPO (nor of the Berne Union). It would not, therefore, beamen ber of the WIPO General Assembly, if that body we reto act as a unitary Assembly. Article 13(6) would preserve its right to be admitted to meetings of the WIPO General Assembly as observer for matters concerning the Paris Convention.
- 13.11 *Article13(7)(a)* implements the proposal that the periodicity of ordinary sessions of the governing bodies of WIPO and the Union sadministered by WIPO be changed from once every two years to annually (see, also, Article 6(4) of the WIPO Convention indocument WO/GA/WG-CR/4/2).
- 13.12 *Article13(7)(b)* dealswiththerighttoconvokeextraordinarysessionsofth e AssemblycompetentfortheParisUnion.Onechangehasbeenproposedtothisprovisionfor consideration.ThechangeisthedeletionofthepoweroftheExecutiveCommitteetorequest theconvocationofanextraordinarysessionoftheAssembly.Thisc hangeisproposedin viewofthepossibleoptionspresentedforthecompositionoftheCoordinationCommittee, oneofwhichenvisagesde -linkingthecompositionoftheCoordinationCommitteefromthe ExecutiveCommitteesoftheParisandBerneUnions(see AlternativeBofArticle8in documentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/2).Sincethepowertoconvoke anextraordinarysessionofthe AssemblyrestswiththeDirectorGeneralandwithone -fourthofthecountriesmembersof Assembly,thechangeisnotconsideredtobeasig nificantoneinpractice.

- 14.01 *Article14* establishesanddefinesthefunctionsoftheExecutiveCommitteeofthe ParisUnion.InthemeetingsoftheWorkingGroup,ithasbeengenerallyagreedthatthe ExecutiveCommitteehasceasedtofulfilan ypracticalfunction(seedocuments WO/GA/WG-CR/3,paragraphs41to43,WO/GA/WG -CR/2/4andWO/GA/WG -CR/2/8, paragraphs35to43).Itsimportancecontinues,however,asthetechnicalmeansbywhich, togetherwiththeExecutiveCommitteeoftheBerneUnio n,thecompositionofthe CoordinationCommitteeisdetermined(seeArticle8(1)oftheWIPOConventionand documentA/36/11).
- 14.02 ThefateoftheExecutiveCommitteeoftheParisUnionthereforedependsuponthe decisionstakenbytheWorkingGroupwith respecttothecompositionandfunctionsofthe WIPOCoordinationCommittee(seethevariousproposalswithrespecttoArticle8ofthe WIPOConventionindocumentWO/GA/WG -CR/4/2).Inconsequence,twoalternativesare proposedforArticle14ofthePari sConvention. *AlternativeA* envisagesthemaintenanceof the *statusquo* withrespecttotheExecutiveCommittee. *AlternativeB* envisagesthedeletion ofArticle14and,consequently,theabolitionoftheExecutiveCommittee.
