Two treaties System: Madrid Agreement Madrid Protocol Common Regulations 2015: One-treaty System Madrid Protocol Common Regulations 2020: Common Regulations become **Regulations under the Protocol**

A change in name, to adapt to the one treaty System
A change of all the Madrid System
New Regulations for a new Treaty



Overview of the Renewal

- Every ten years upon payment of the relevant fee
- No changes at the renewal
- For some or all Contracting Parties
- Possibility to renew all the refused goods and services
- Possibility to renew, when there is a partial protection for only the goods and services protected.

Rule 30(2)(d): Where a statement under Rule 18ter(2)(ii) or (4) is recorded in the International Register, the international registration shall not be renewed in respect of the designated Contracting Party concerned for the goods and services that are not included in that statement, unless payment of the required fees is accompanied by a statement by the holder that the international registration is to be renewed also for those goods and services. Frademark System

The <u>renewal fee</u> was calculated taking into account only the <u>classes protected</u>, <u>unless</u> the <u>holder states</u> that the international registration is to be renewed also for <u>the goods and services refused.</u>

What changes in the renewal from February 2020?

- Amendments to Rule 30
- Simplification of the renewal

Renewal for a Contracting Party that has granted partial protection (before Feb 2020) Rule 30(2)(d): Where a statement under Rule 18ter(2)(ii) or (4) is recorded in the International Register, the international registration shall not be renewed in respect of the designated Contracting Party concerned for the goods and services that are not included in that statement, unless payment of the required fees is accompanied by a statement by the holder that the international registration is to be renewed also for those goods and services.

Rule 30 (1) (c) [...] where a statement under Rule 18ter(2) or (4) has been recorded in the International Register for a Contracting Party in respect of which payment of individual fee is due [...], the amount of that individual fee shall be established taking into account the goods and services included in the said statement only.

Contracting Parties with an individual fee per class: renewal fee calculated taking into account <u>only classes</u> <u>for which protection has been granted.</u>

Holders of international registrations who have been granted partial protection and are appealing such decision will no longer be required to pay individual fees for classes that are not protected upon renewal.




