Michael Healy is the Executive Director (International Relations) at Copyright Clearance Center and is based in New York City.

Prior to joining CCC, Michael was Executive Director of The Book Rights Registry and previously Executive Director of the Book Industry Study Group (BISG).

Before moving to the United States in 2006, Michael worked for more than 20 years in the publishing industry in the UK, spending most of that time in senior editorial, sales and distribution roles in digital publishing.

For much of his career, Michael has been closely involved in the development of standards for the international book trade. He has been Chairman of the International ISBN Agency, a Director of the International DOI Foundation, and he led the international ISO committee that developed ISBN-

He currently chairs the International Standard Name Identifier (ISNI) Agency and is a director of the UK Copyright Hub. He is a frequent speaker at international conferences on copyright, licensing, and future trends in publishing.

Mr. Tim DEVENPORT



After an extensive career in publishing and a decade as an independent business consultant and project manager, Tim joined the staff of the standards organization EDItEUR (<https://www.editeur.org>) in 2011.

Prior to joining EDItEUR, he worked with many of the major STM, academic and business publishers, including Nature Publishing Group, Palgrave Macmillan, Thomson and Elsevier. In the standards arena, he has helped international and cross-industry bodies like EDItEUR and ICEDIS to develop frameworks that allow for automated and effective information and transactional exchange.

Alongside its standards work, EDItEUR offers specialist support to a number of agencies involved in supplying persistent identifiers. Since 2016 Tim has been Executive Director of the ISNI International Agency – a group that promotes and oversees the worldwide use of the International Standard Name Identifier.

A sibling of other ISO standards like ISBN, ISAN and ISSN, the ISNI (<https://isni.org>) is used across a range of sectors – including scholarly literature, libraries, rights management organizations and the music industry – to uniquely identify the public identities of creative individuals and organizations.

Mr. Andrew MacEwan



Andrew is the Head of Metadata at the British library with responsibility for the cataloguing and metadata production processes for all of the Library's digital and print collections received on legal deposit.

Andrew joined the Library in 1987 and has worked in a variety of roles across the library's technical services departments.

Internationally he has worked on a number of library working groups on name and subject authority control standards, including the IFLA Working Group on Functional Requirements and Numbering of Authority Records (FRANAR).

Andrew also served as member of the Policy Committee of the Program For Cooperative Cataloging for 20 years from 1999 to 2019. He also was a member of the ISO Committee 27729 responsible for drafting the International Standard Name Identifier (ISNI).

Since 2010 he has served on the governing Board of the ISNI International Agency.

Mr. Emma ROGOZ



Emma is responsible for managing authority control and identifier management operations at the British Library, and also manages the British Library's operations as an ISNI Registration Agency.

She recently led the development of a self-service portal for ISNI registrations which went live in 2021.

She joined the British Library in 2000 and has worked in the areas of authority control, cataloguing and training with external commitments in the areas of ISNI and Dewey Decimal Classification.

She works with the ISNI International Agency liaising with current and potential ISNI members, and the ISNI Assignment Agency, OCLC, on matters regarding ISNI data quality, policy and best practice.

She has recently been appointed the chair of the newly formed ISNI Technical Advisory Committee and is also part of the steering groups of the ISNI Libraries Group and the ISNI Research Sector Group.
