



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

- Remain Internationally Connected: Signatory to 15 WIPO treaties. Member of various PPHes in over 30 major markets.

#### **Quality IP Register**

- Speed with quality -Positive grant patent system, investments in Patent Examination capabilities.
- Patents, Trade Marks: Fast track scheme, SG IP Fast



## Responsive to Business Needs

- Trade Marks: Allow multiple classes in one application and registration of nonconventional marks
- Designs: Designers own commissioned designs, regime for virtual designs
- **Geographical Indications**: Registry started operations



- **Discover IA** 6-week programme by IPOS.Int to enable enterprises to better understand their IAs and develop an action plan to use this to drive business growth
- Intangible Disclosure Evaluation and Audit Scheme (IDEAS) joint initiative with SGX
- **IPOS Go app** world's first mobile app for trade mark registration with new features to allow all-in-one-search, and renewal functions
- **SG IP Fast** world's fastest patent grant programme (6 months) expanded to include trade marks and registered designs

Singapore Police Force – Intellectual Property Rights Branch (IPRB) – Enforcement agency that works to combat IPR infringements within Singapore.



**Singapore Customs** – Lead agency for trade facilitation and revenue enforcement, provides border enforcement of IP rights.



**Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA) –** Develops and regulates the converging infocomm and media sectors. IMDA also promotes and <u>regulates data protection in Singapore</u> through the Personal Data Protection Commission.


