PROPOSAL OF THE DELEGATION OF GERMANY (FEDERAL REPUBLIC)

DRAFT QUESTIONNAIRE

Questions on "systematic use" of non-patent literature (NPL) such as technical periodicals, progress reports, conference papers, etc., for the purpose of searching.

1. In what form and manner is NPL filed in your Office?

- (a) in the form of bound volumes,
- (b) in the form of a selection of technical publications from periodicals, etc., and filed according to date of publication,
- (c) according to classification:
 - (i) national patent classification (indicate which),
 - (ii) International Patent Classification
 (Int. Cl.),
 - (iii) Universal Decimal Classification,
 - (iv) other classifications (indicate which),
- (d) according to other criteria (indicate which).

2. In which way NPL is made accessible to examiners in your Office?

- (a) by presentation of periodicals, etc., at a central place, such as in a search room,
- (b) by circulation of periodicals, etc., among examiners for:
 - (i) selection of copies of full articles or parts thereof to be entered in the search file,

- (ii) information, training, encouraging awareness of technical development,
- (c) selection of technical articles or parts thereof by experts outside the examination staff but within your Office for entering into the examiner's search file,
