- Only recently, have we begun to collaborate with WIPO in this field

RAISING AWARENESS

- In most cases, SMEs attended these dissemination events
- Nevertheless, plenty still needs to be done specifically for SMEs on CTM & RCD awareness

- The registration of CTMs & RCDs is a regulatory matter
- The CTMR & the RCDR must be complied with

Consequently, there is little room to manoeuvre

 Notwithstanding, the CTMR & the RCDR present a number of features that may appeal to SMEs
