



Key questions in the negotiations on TK and TCEs

- Why protect? *Aims and objectives*
- What to protect? Subject matter
- Who should benefit? Beneficiaries
- What acts should be forbidden? Scope
- Should there be exceptions and limitations?
- For how long? Term of protection
- How should rights be managed?
- Should there be formalities?
- What sanctions or penalties apply?
- Should rights be retrospective?
- How should foreign right holders be treated?

- Fundamental to development of operative text
- Link between objectives and substantive provisions
- Simple, direct and efficient wording
- What kind of harm(s) an IP instrument on TK and TCEs would seek to address? Which gaps ought to be filled?





- How to define subject matter?
 - First step: Define subject matter that is generally relevant (Use of terms)
 - Second step: Determine exactly which portion of the general subject matter is to be protected through criteria of eligibility





Beneficiaries

- Who should benefit?
 - IPLCs
 - Should there be other beneficiaries beyond IPLCs?



Scope of protection

- Seeks to determine
 - Measures to be adopted
 - Rights to be granted
- Tiered or differentiated approach:

Different kinds or levels of rights or measures would be available to rights holders depending on the nature and characteristics of the subject matter, the level of control retained by the beneficiaries and its degree of diffusion

- Restricted access + closely held
- Not restricted + not closely held





- Should exceptions and limitations be established at an international level?
- Should there be flexibility at the national level to fully regulate exceptions and limitations?
- Should general and specific exceptions be established?
 - General exceptions
 - Test to be applied at the national level when developing limitations and exceptions / could include elements of the "classic" three-step test and moral-right components
 - Specific exceptions
 - Kinds of exceptions that should be allowed





- Should the term of protection be linked to the continuous fulfillment of criteria of eligibility?
- Distinction between economic rights and moral rights?





Formalities

- Should there be formalities? Registers or other records?
- Should formalities be a precondition for protection?





- Should Member States put in place/adopt/provide measures to address violations of the rights / infringements / to ensure the application of the instrument?
 - What kind of measures?
 - When should sanctions or remedies be applied?
 - What would be the role of the beneficiaries in this context, if any?
- Would a general framework and leaving the details to national legislation be sufficient?
- TK and TCEs texts contain several different concepts





- How and by whom rights and interests should be administered?
- Possibility to establish/designate a competent authority to administer the rights/interests provided for by this instrument
- No agreement on the extent of participation of the beneficiaries: in (close) consultation with / with the explicit consent of / in conjunction with / with the direct involvement and approval of / with the free, prior and informed consent of?
- Should flexibility be left to implement arrangements related to competent authorities at the national level?



Transitional measures

- Consensus in both texts that the instrument should apply to all TK/TCEs which, at the moment of entry into force, fulfill the criteria of protection
- Drafting not identical
- Different options presented on the question of acquired rights of third parties





Relationship with international agreements

- Mutually supportive manner?
- Should a non-derogation clause be included? Either separately or in this provision?





National treatment

Should foreign beneficiaries be granted the same rights and benefits as national beneficiaries?





- How to deal with TK/TCEs shared across national borders?
- Would cooperation, with the involvement of IPLCs be a solution?

- When would this review be undertaken?
