

ANNOTATED DRAFT AGENDA

1. Opening of the session

Brief description: The Chair of the CDIP will open the session and invite the Director General of WIPO to deliver his welcoming remarks.

2. Adoption of the Agenda

Brief description: The draft agenda is a truncated agenda, in light of the format and duration of the session. It has been prepared following consultations held by the Chair of the CDIP, Her Excellency, Ms. Patricia Benedetti of El Salvador, with Member States, on April 30, 2021. The Draft Agenda (CDIP/26/1 Prov. 3) includes the two proposals by Member States (one by Brazil and one by Mexico) submitted to the Secretariat after the above-mentioned consultation meeting.

3. General Statements

4. Monitor, assess, discuss and report on the implementation of all Development Agenda Recommendations

(a) Progress Reports

Brief description: The annual Progress Reports provide an overview on the implementation of the ongoing DA projects, and achievements in the implementation of the 45 DA Recommendations. For this session, in view of the time constraints, it has been agreed by Member States in above-mentioned meeting called by the Chair of the Committee (on April 30, 2021), that the report on the implementation of the 45 DA Recommendations will be presented to the next session of the CDIP. Following the introduction of the document by the Secretariat, the floor will be opened for comments. Project Managers will be available to respond to any questions or comments.

- *the extension by 18 months of the project on Intellectual Property and Gastronomic Tourism in Peru and Other Developing Countries: Promoting the Development of Gastronomic Tourism through Intellectual Property (contained in Annex V);*
- *the extension by 12 months of the project on Copyright and the Distribution of Content in the Digital Environment (contained in Annex VI);*
- *the proposed deferment of the start date of the project on Development of the Music Sector and New Economic Models of Music in Burkina Faso and in Certain Countries of the West African Economic and Monetary Union (WAEMU) (contained in Annex VII), to January 2022.*

(b) Report on WIPO's Contribution to the Implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals and its Associated Targets

4.(i) WIPO Technical Assistance in the Area of Cooperation for Development

(a) Future Webinars

Brief description: While discussing the Report on the Webinars on Technical Assistance ([CDIP/25/3](#)) and the Evaluation Report of WIPO Webinars on Technical Assistance ([CDIP/25/4](#)), the 25th session of the CDIP decided¹ that the CDIP Secretariat should continue holding webinars, bearing in mind the recommendations provided in document CDIP/25/4 and the comments made by Member States. The Committee further agreed that the Secretariat would present a document to its next session in order to seek Member States' guidance on the strategy for delivering future webinars². Document CDIP/26/6 contains the Secretariat's proposed strategy for the organization of future webinars, presenting two options on the process for the selection of topics and other aspects. Following the introduction of the document by the Secretariat, the floor will be opened for comments.

Invited action: *the Committee will be invited to consider the information contained in document CDIP/26/6, and decide based on which of the two options described in the document, i.e. Option I "Upon Member States' Request" or Option II "Based on the Secretariat's Proposal"³, the Secretariat should continue holding webinars.*
