Committee of Experts

Sixteenth Session (Geneva, March 21 to 28, 1988)

NOTE*

The Committee of Experts of the International Patent Classification (IPC) Union held its sixteenth session in Geneva from March 21 to 28, 1988.¹ Fifteen States, members of the Committee of Experts— Belgium, Denmark, Egypt, Finland, France, Germany (Federal Republic of), Japan, Netherlands, Republic of Korea, Soviet Union, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States of America—and the European Patent Office (EPO) were represented at the session. The list of participants follows this Note.

This session was the fourth of the fourth series of sessions of the Committee of Experts. Each series of sessions lead to the adoption of a new edition of the IPC. The present (fourth) series will result in the fifth edition of the IPC. That edition will be published in 1989 and will enter into force on January 1, 1990.

The Committee of Experts approved amendments (in both the English and the French versions) submitted to it by the Working Group on Search Information of the WIPO Permanent Committee on Patent Information (PCPI). Those amendments affect six classes and 166 subclasses of the IPC and relate to the following areas:

- Section A: 24 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass A 62 C, dealing with fire-fighting, which was substantially revised;
- Section B: 39 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass B 23 K, dealing with welding;

- Section C: three classes and 18 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclasses C 09 D and C 09 J, dealing with coating compositions and adhesives, respectively, which were substantially revised;
- Section D: four subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass D 06 M, dealing with treatment of fibers, fabrics or the like, which was substantially revised;
- Section E: 12 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass E 06 B, dealing with closures for openings in buildings, which was substantially revised;
- Section F: two classes and 22 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass F 16 H, dealing with transmissions, which was substantially revised;
- Section G: one class and 26 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass G 01 S, dealing with systems for determining direction or position, which was substantially revised;
- Section H: 21 subclasses affected; they include, in particular, subclass H 04 L, dealing with transmission of digital information.

The Committee of Experts endorsed (in respect of IPC matters) the program of the Permanent Committee on Industrial Property Information (PCIPI) for the 1988-89 biennium.

The Committee of Experts agreed to establish the *ad hoc* Working Group on the Revision of the Guide to the IPC.

The Committee of Experts considered the recommendations made by the third Advanced IPC Seminar, held at the European Patent Office (EPO) in The Hague in October 1987, and endorsed the majority of them.


