\*Advisory Group on IT could give technical advice and policy guidance to the Director General on the overall IT strategy of WIPO and priority settings within WIPO's IT Strategic Implementation Plan

\*Standing Committee on Technical Standards and Documentation should adopt new or revised WIPO standards, policies, recommendations and statements of principle relating to intellectual property data, data dissemination and documentation and should report directly to the WIPO General Assembly

\*Working methods indicated in paragraphs 23 and 26 would increase efficiency of meetings.
