

To access the current real time statistics and assess the notifications coming to a national office in the next two weeks please follow these steps.

Firstly go to the WIPO Madrid page by following this link: <http://www.wipo.int/madrid/en/>

On this page, scroll down to the 'Resources' heading. Under the section 'For IP Offices, Current Members', click on 'International applications and subsequent designations'. This is highlighted below:

The following example is for International applications to the European Union.

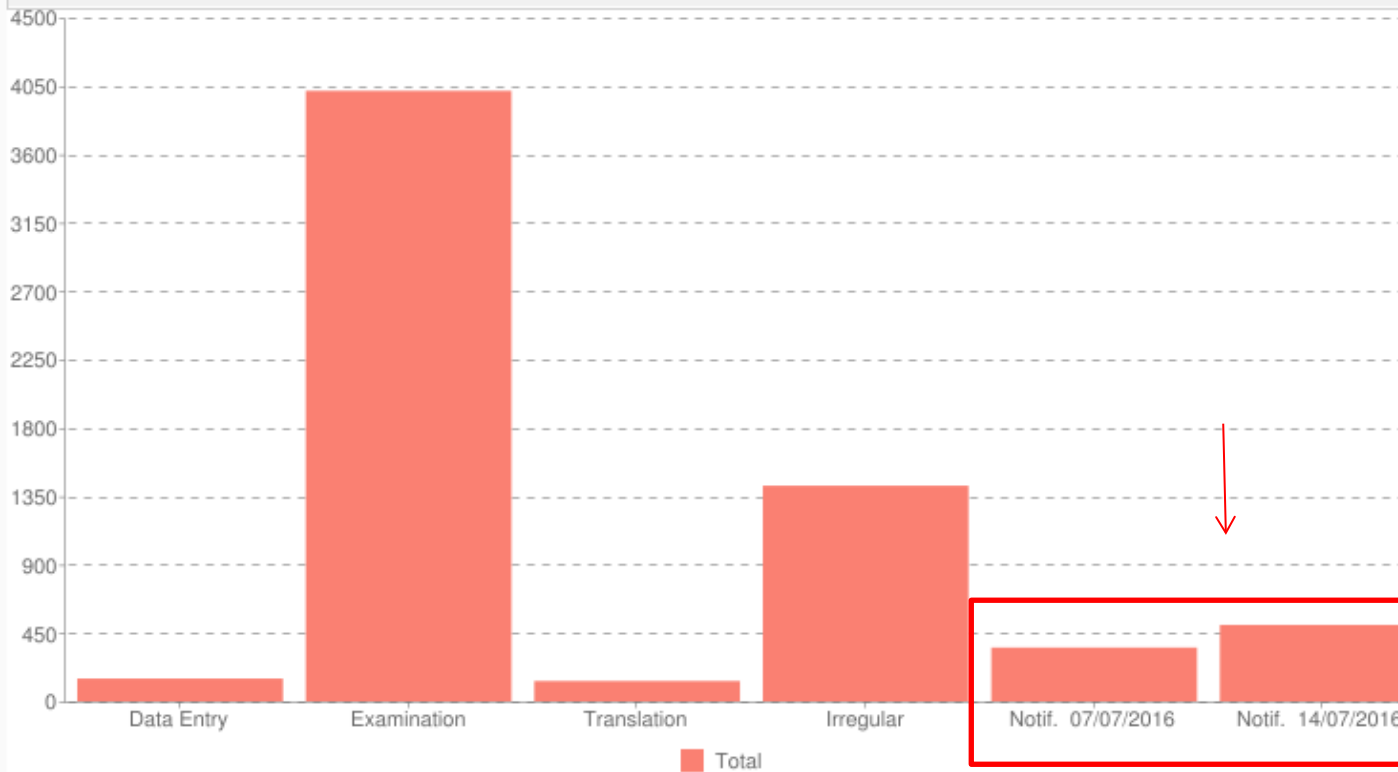
Please note that the quantity of notifications expected for the next two week are shown on the right side of the graph, and are highlighted below:
