This Circular is addressed to your Office in its capacity as a receiving Office, International Searching Authority, International Preliminary Examining Authority and/or designated or elected Office under the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT). It is also being sent to interested intergovernmental organizations as well as certain non-governmental organizations representing users of the PCT system.

This Circular concerns proposals for change to the Standard for the Filing and Processing in Electronic Form of International Applications (Annex F of the Administrative Instructions under the PCT).

DESCRIPTION OF CHANGES

Proposed changes to Annex F and its appendices are set out in the following Proposal for Change (PFC) file (available at: http://www.wipo.int/pct/efiling_standard/en/pfc_files.htm):

 PCT/EF/PFC 14/001 (Modification of the demand and related DTDs with the addition of elements and attributes for production usage for the current version of the PCT/IPEA/401 form), proposal by the International Bureau.

The proposed changes to Annex F and its appendices are to address the requirements for rendering the current version of the PCT/IPEA/401 form (September 16, 2012) by the International Preliminary Examining Authority.
