Lithuania

The Patent Law of the Republic of Lithuania No.1-372/1994 as amended by Law No. X-287/2005 does not provide for special provisions in cases of *force majeure*.

The existing Lithuanian patent legislation and practice provides for:

- 1) an extension of a time limit fixed by the Office upon a request made prior to the expiration of a time limit; and
- 2) excusing a failure to comply with a time limit on legitimate grounds (for example *force majeure* circumstances) upon carrying out the omitted act simultaneously with the filing of a request for *restitutio in integrum*.

It is also possible that as part of an emergency preparedness plan, the State Patent Bureau of the Republic of Lithuania could be declared officially closed by an announcement on the website (http://www.vpb.gov.lt/en/) or by other means. An applicant could then rely on Article 4(C)(3) of the Paris Convention and file an application on the next working day after closure is declared.
