The Japan Patent Attorneys Association (JPAA), being the professional association of more than 8,000 patent attorneys practicing in all aspects of intellectual property law in Japan, hereby submits its comments on the issue of Client-Attorney Privilege addressed in WIPO document SCP/13/4 published on February 25, 2009 for the thirteenth session of the Standing Committee on the Law of Patents (SCP).

The JPAA appreciates that the SCP has conducted substantial research and discussions on the laws of many countries. Although it is meritorious to continue such research and discussion, it would also be worthwhile to simultaneously consider what options are available to resolve any issues that arise. For this purpose, the JPAA strongly encourages the SCP to establish a Working Group for resolving the issue of Client-Attorney Privilege.

The JPAA recognizes the necessity of establishing a solution for the issue of Client-Attorney Privilege at the international level, and strongly supports the idea of a treaty on "Client-Attorney Privilege," which should cover Japanese patent attorneys both in private practice and in industry in relation to their clients.
